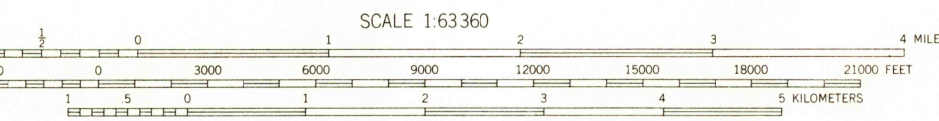

zone 4, shown in blue

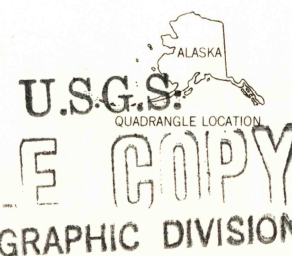
