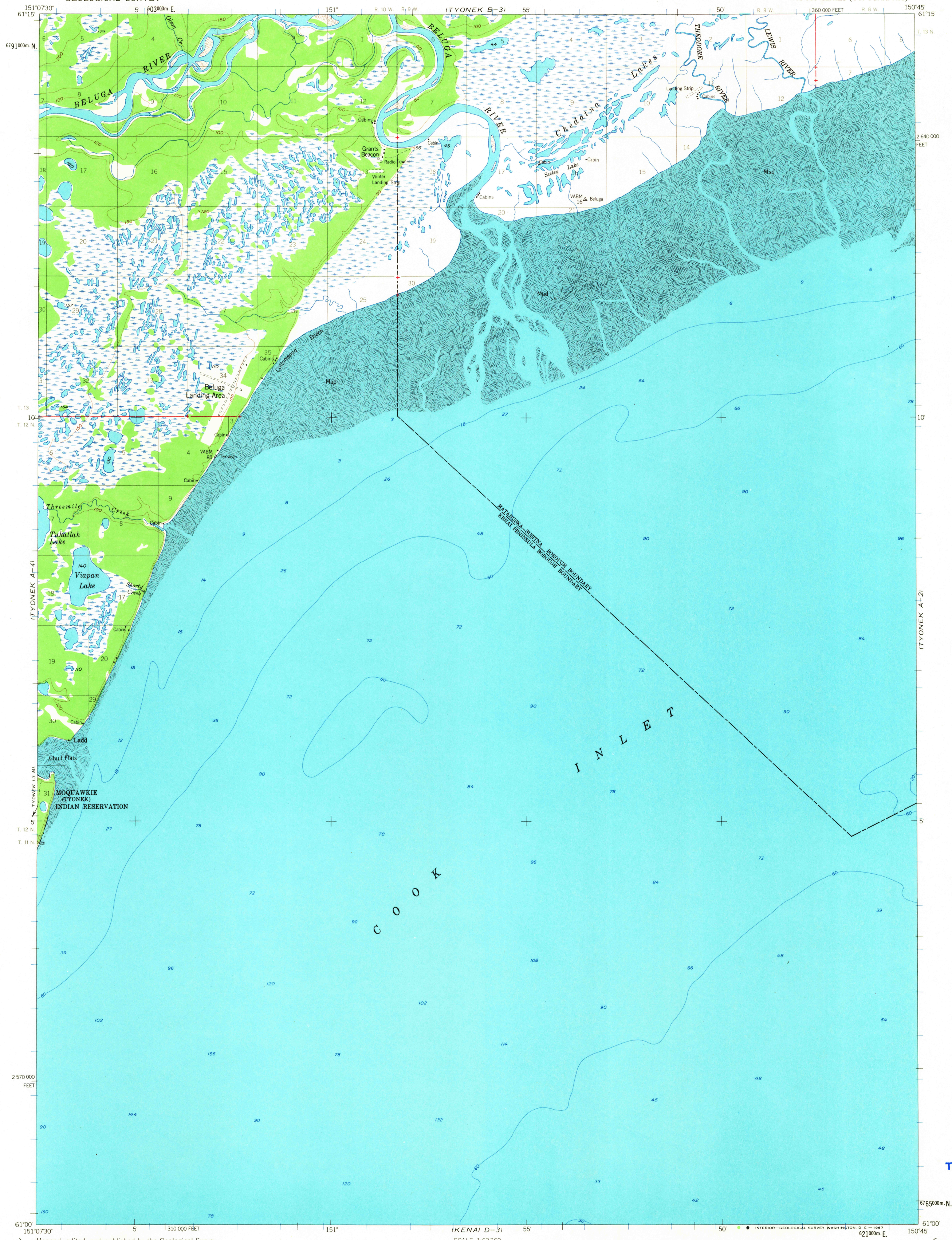

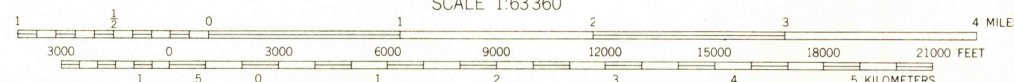
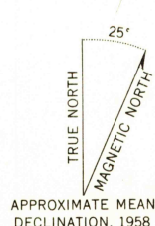

usually of low relief, as interpreted from aerial photographs.

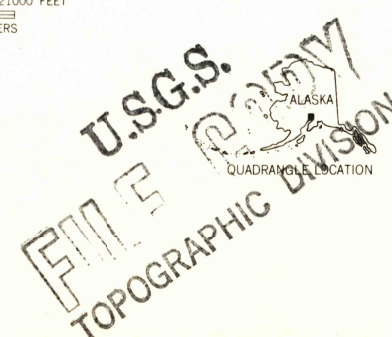
