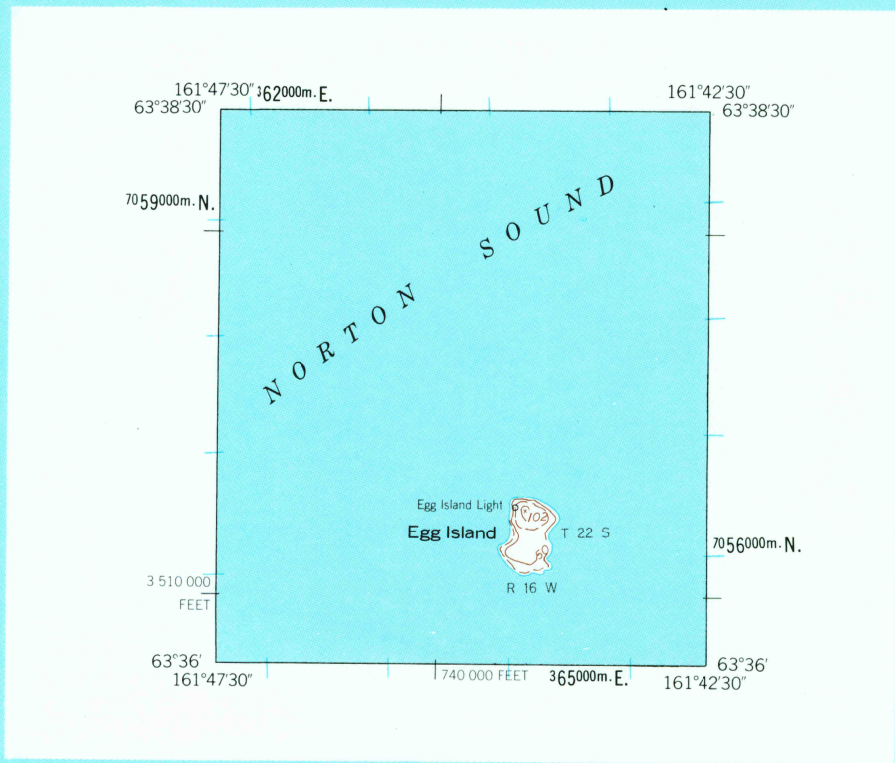
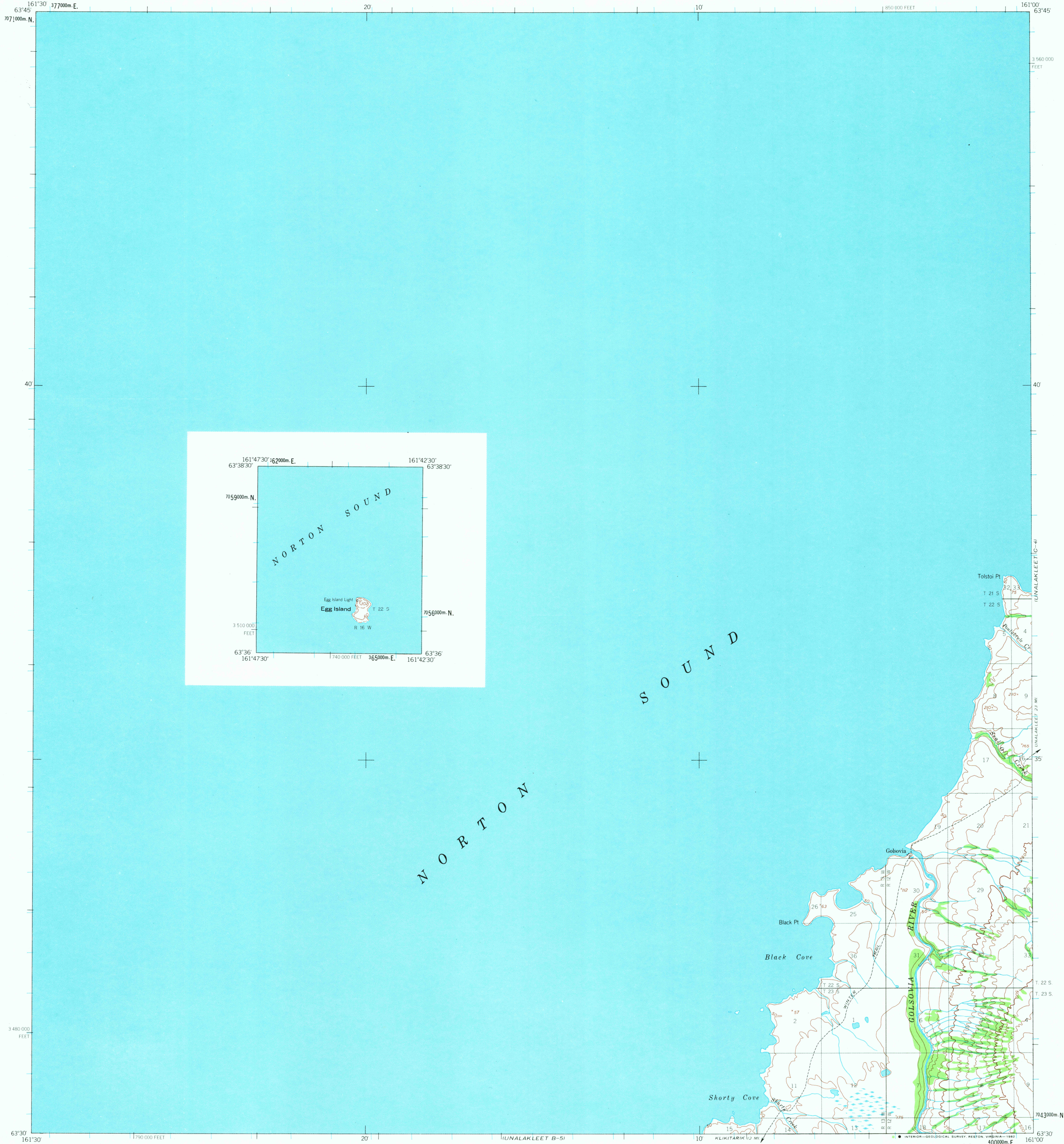




UNALAKLEET (B-4)

Folio K-17, Keteel River Meridian

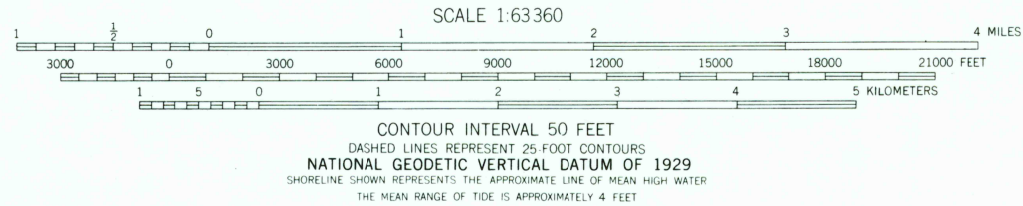
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move
