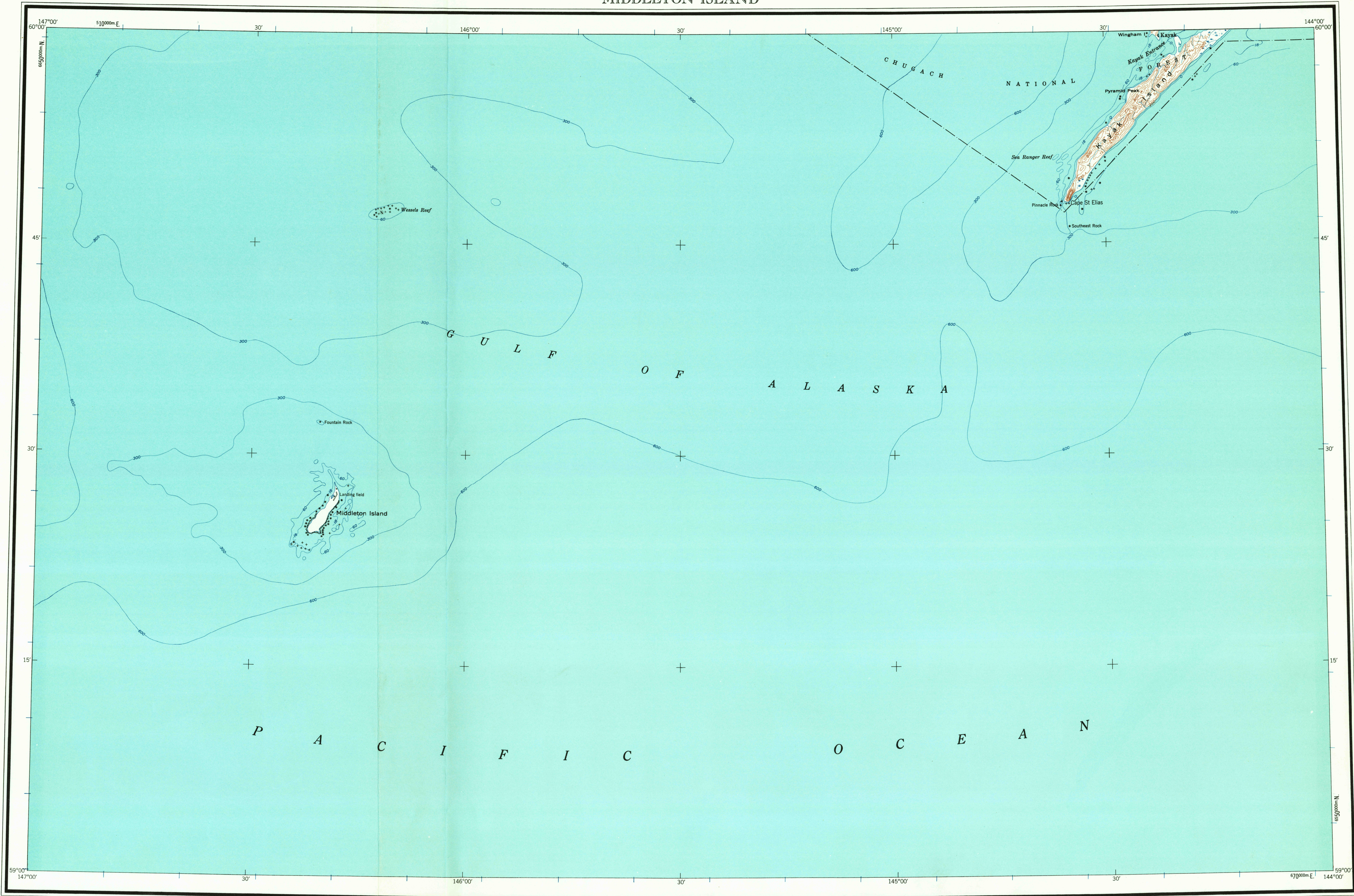


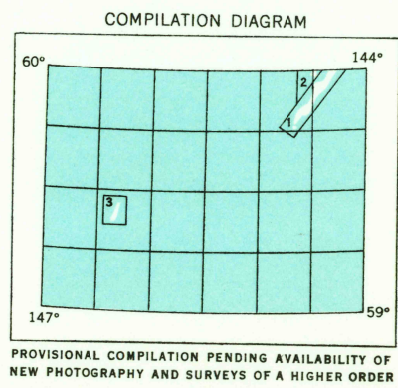

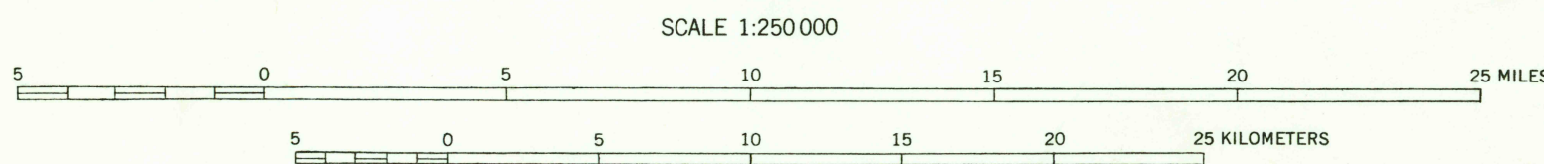

10000-METER GRID TICKS SHOWN IN BLUE

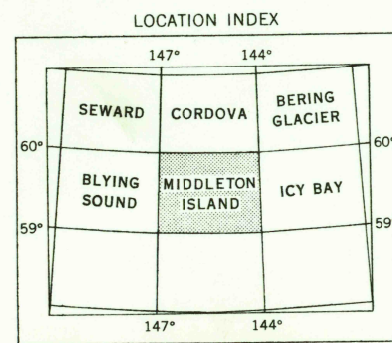


1. TOPOGRAPHY BY MULTIPLEX
