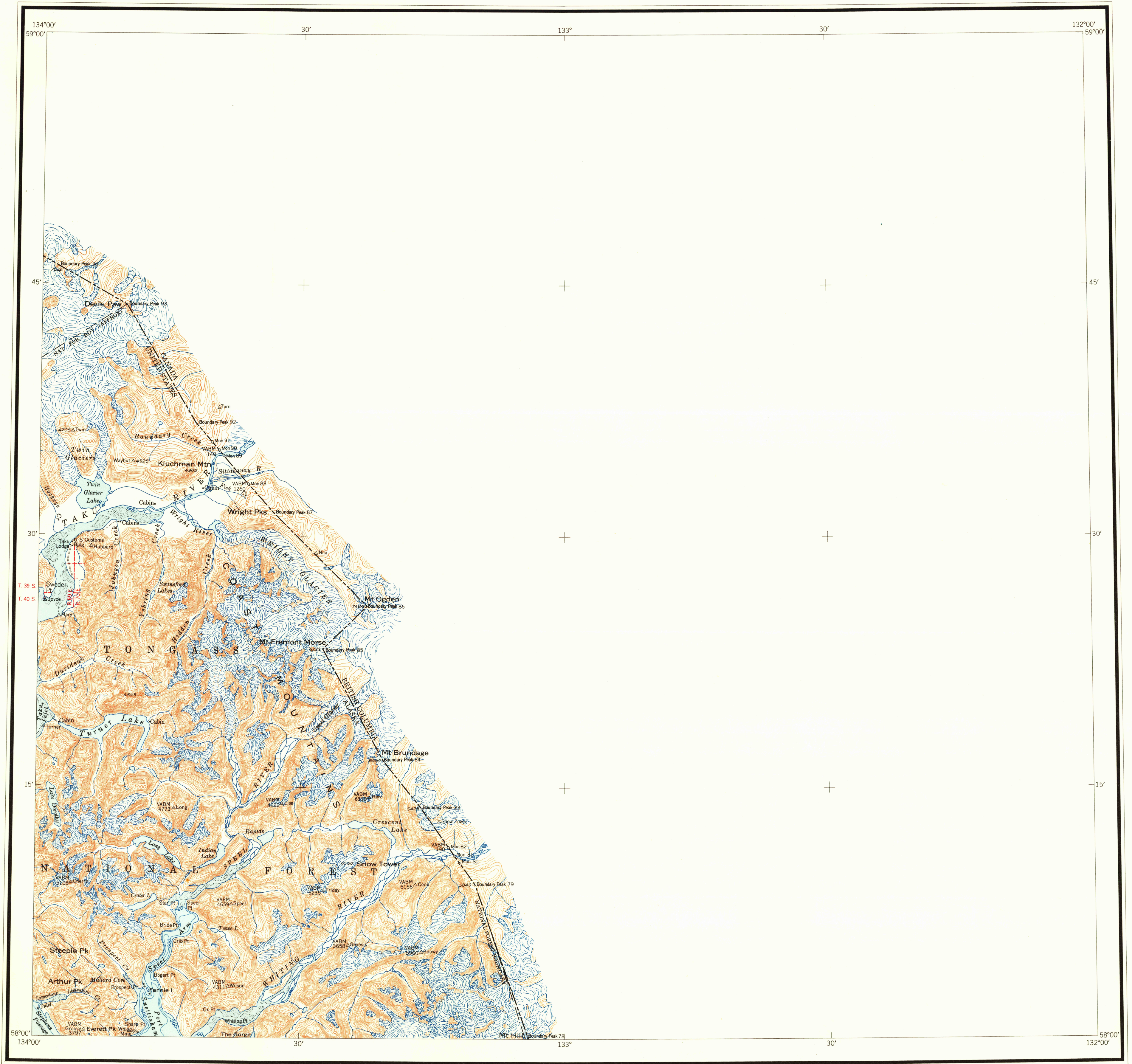




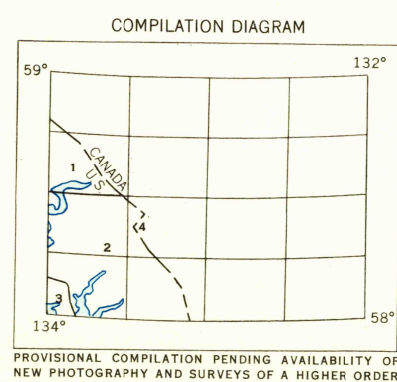

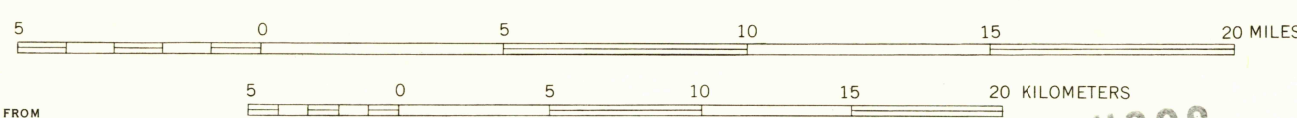
DASHED LAND LINES INDICATE APPROXIMATE LOCATIONS

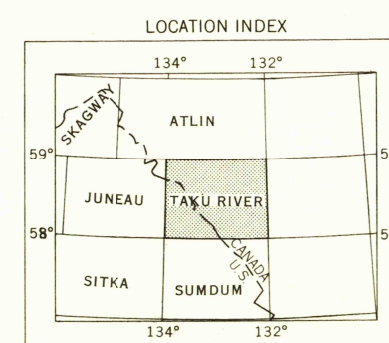
