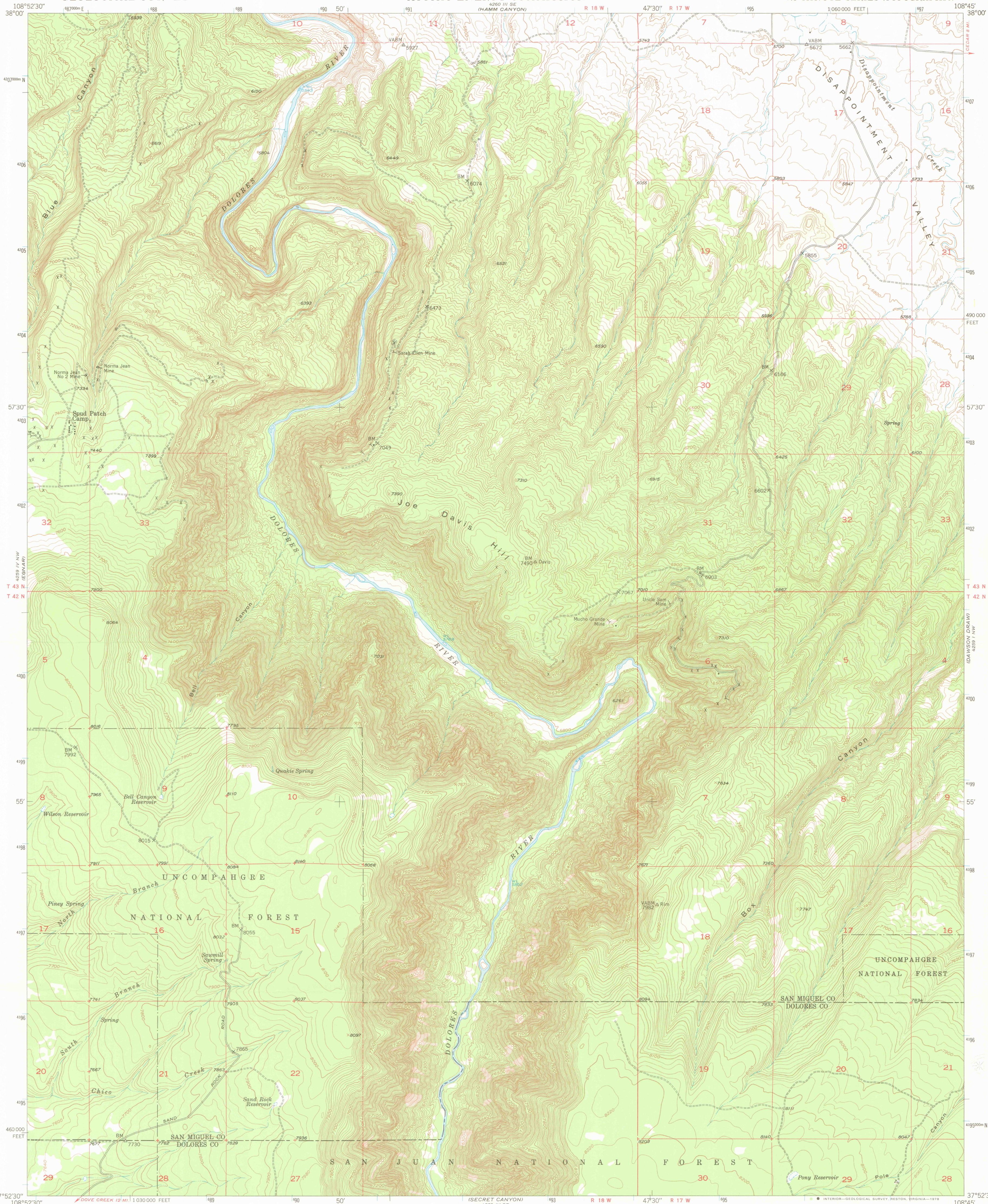

Dashed land lines indicate approximate location

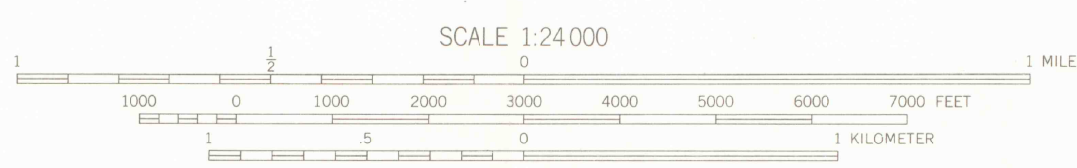
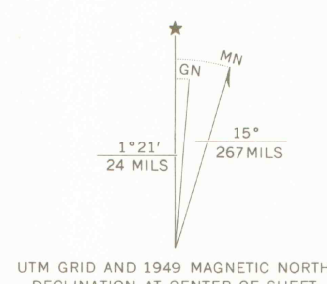
Land lines unsurveyed in part of T. 43 N.-R. 18 W.
