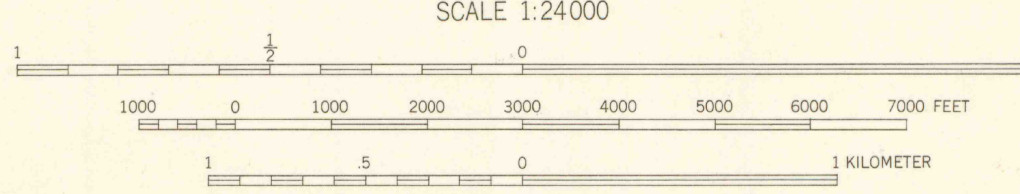
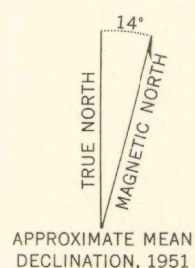

Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations.

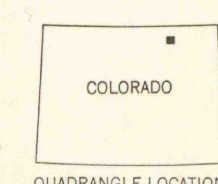
