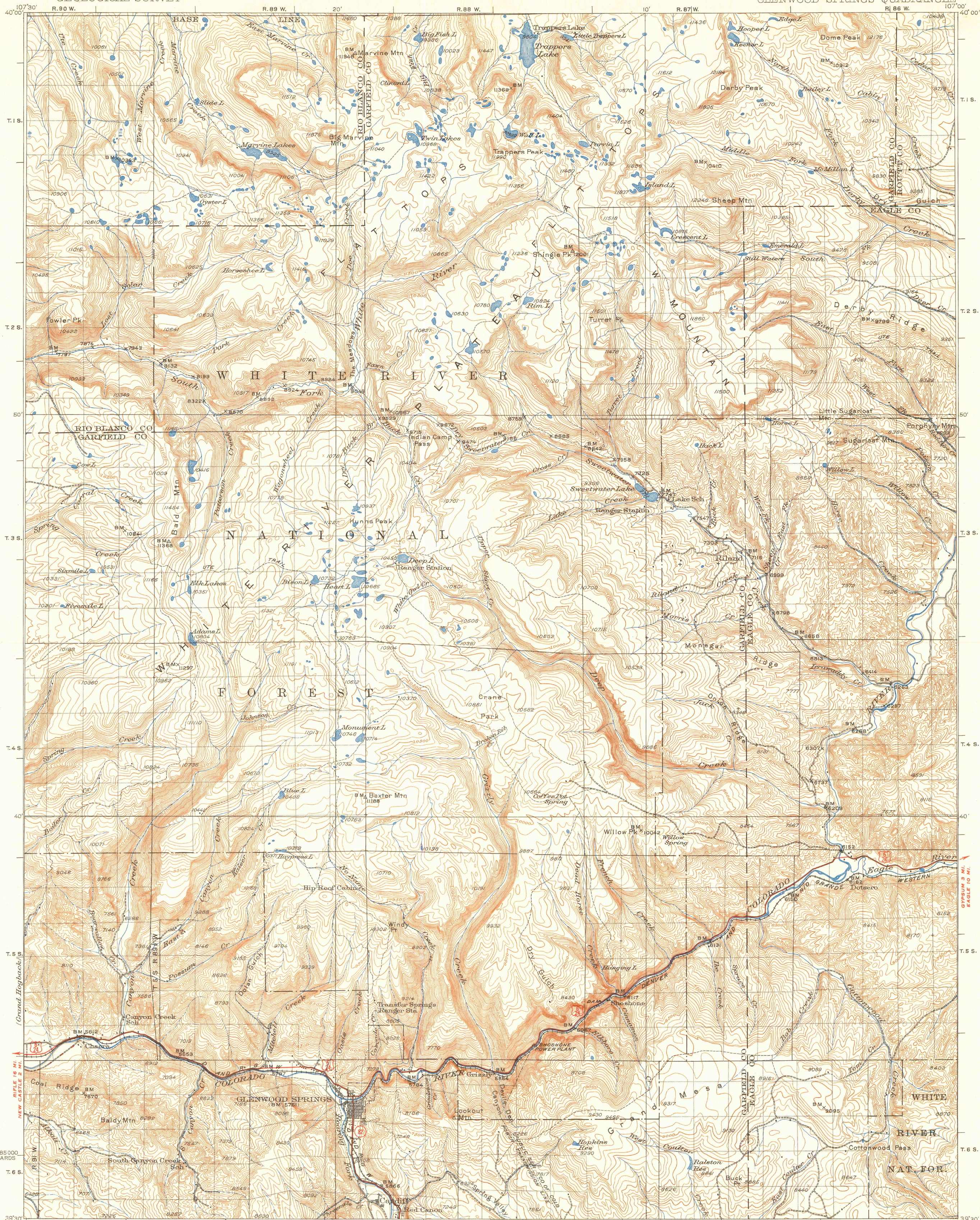

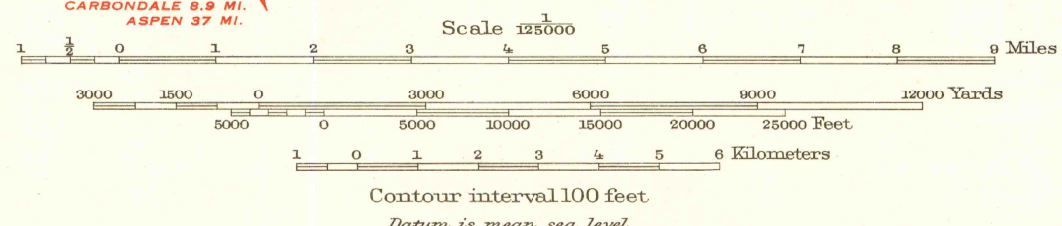


DIAGRAM OF TOWNSHIP
