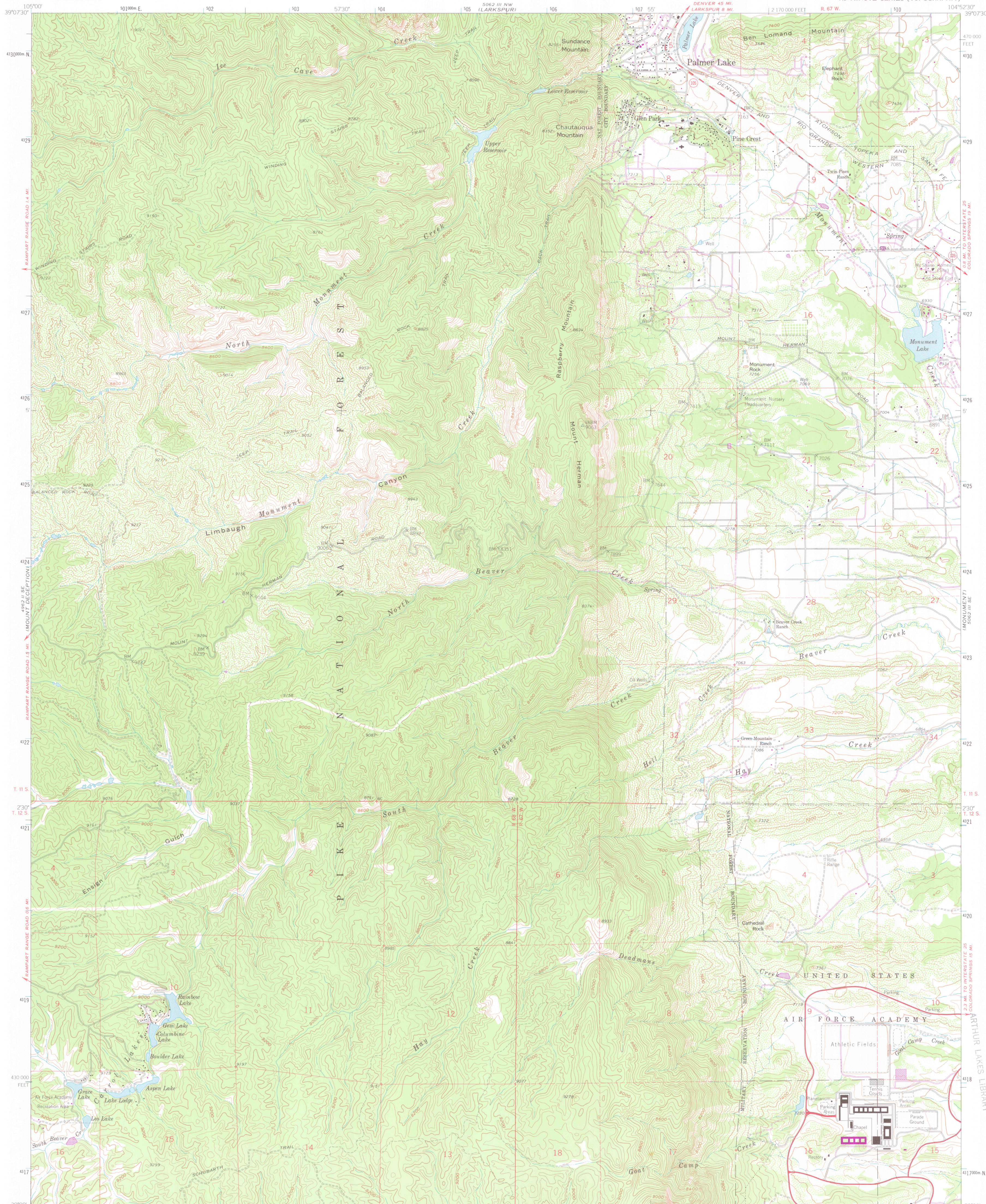

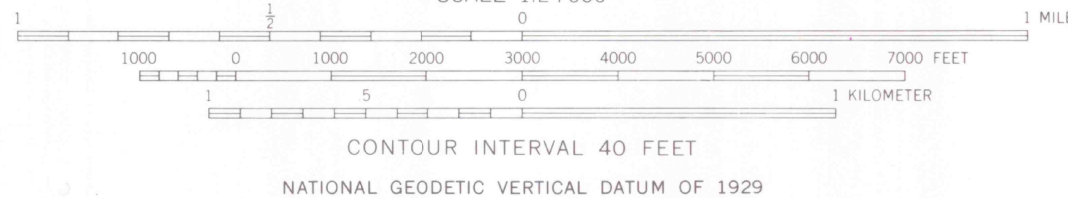
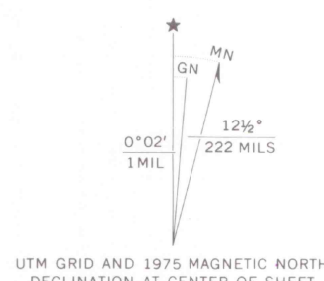

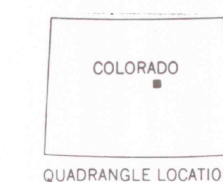
Fine red dashed lines indicate selected fence and field lines where generally visible on aerial photographs. This information is unchecked. Certain land lines are omitted because of insufficient data.
