

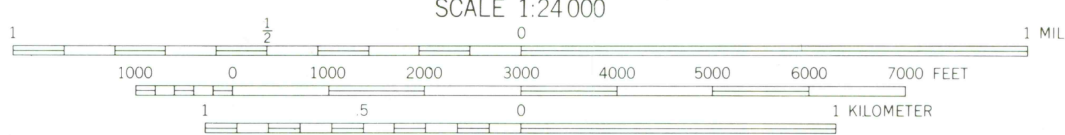
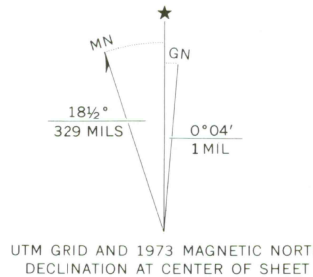

zone 19, shown in blue

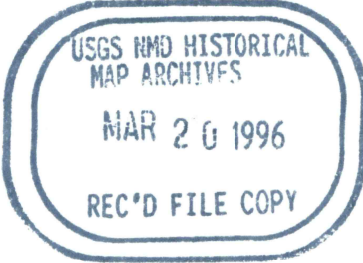
