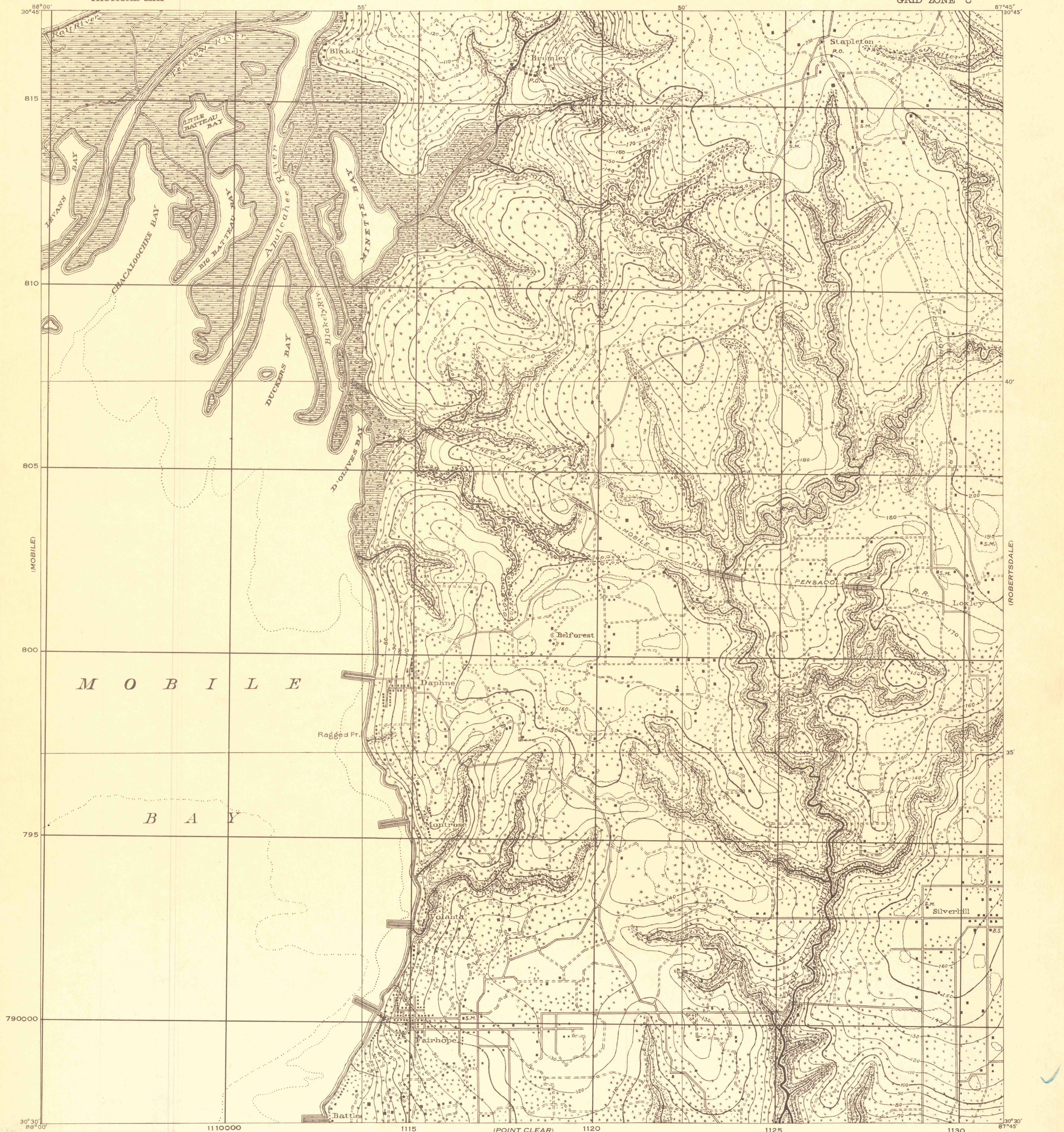

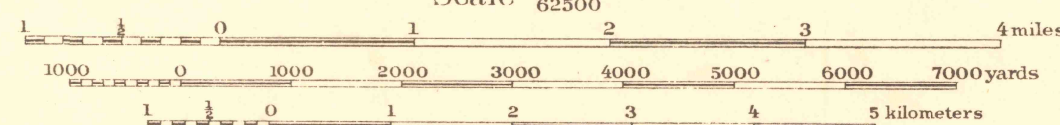
ALABAMA
