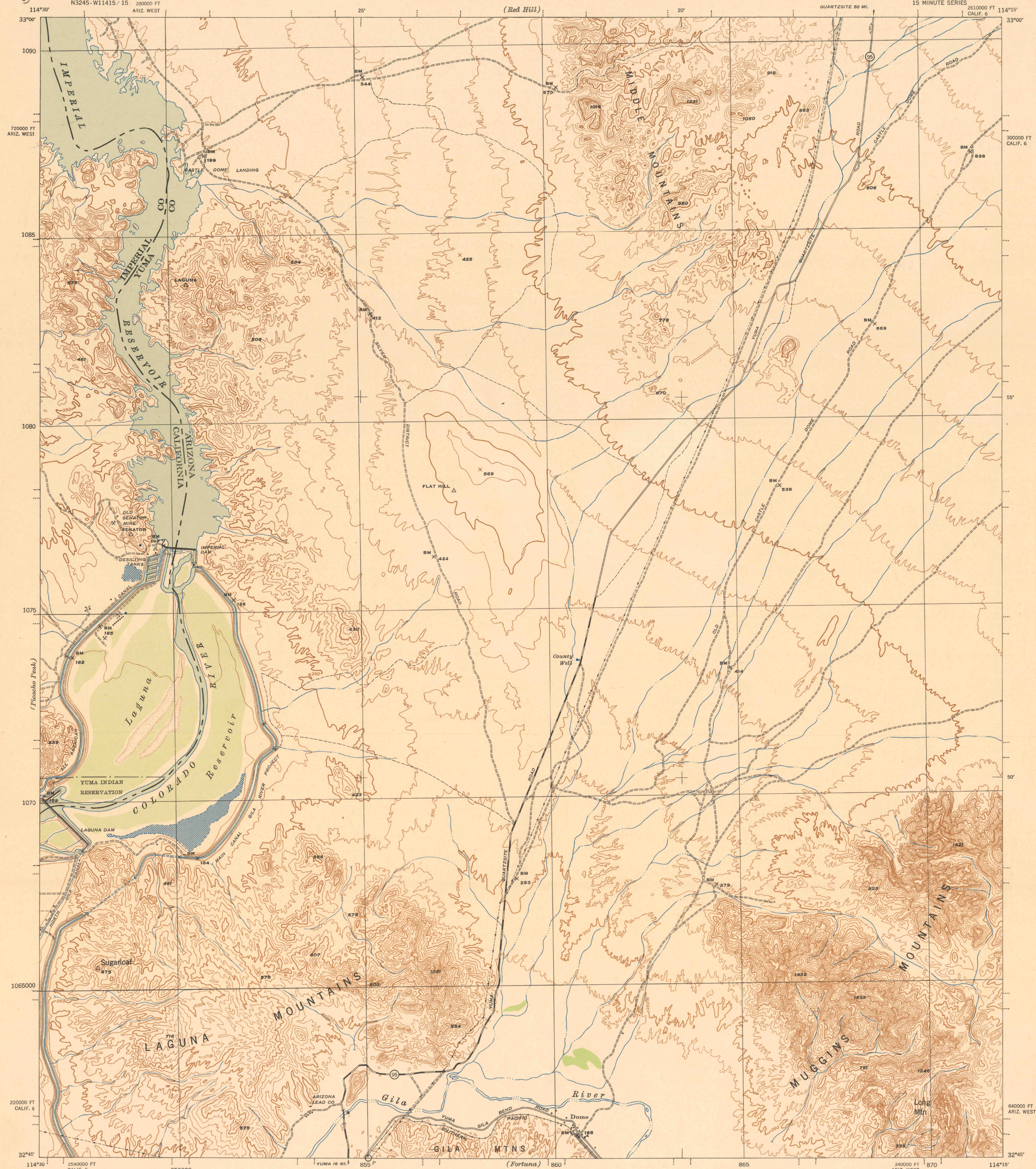

GRID ZONE "F"

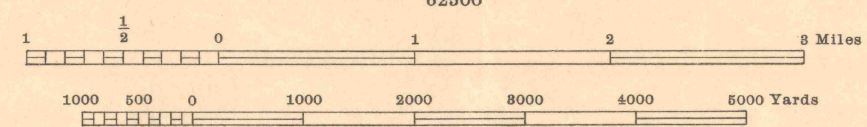

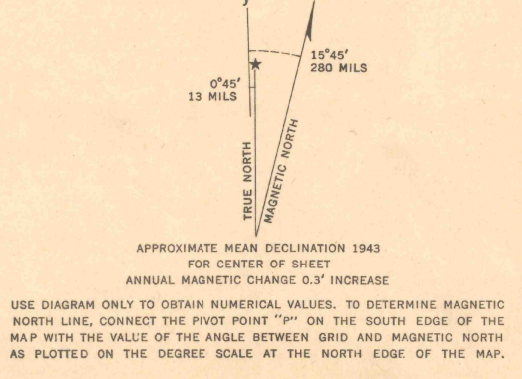
