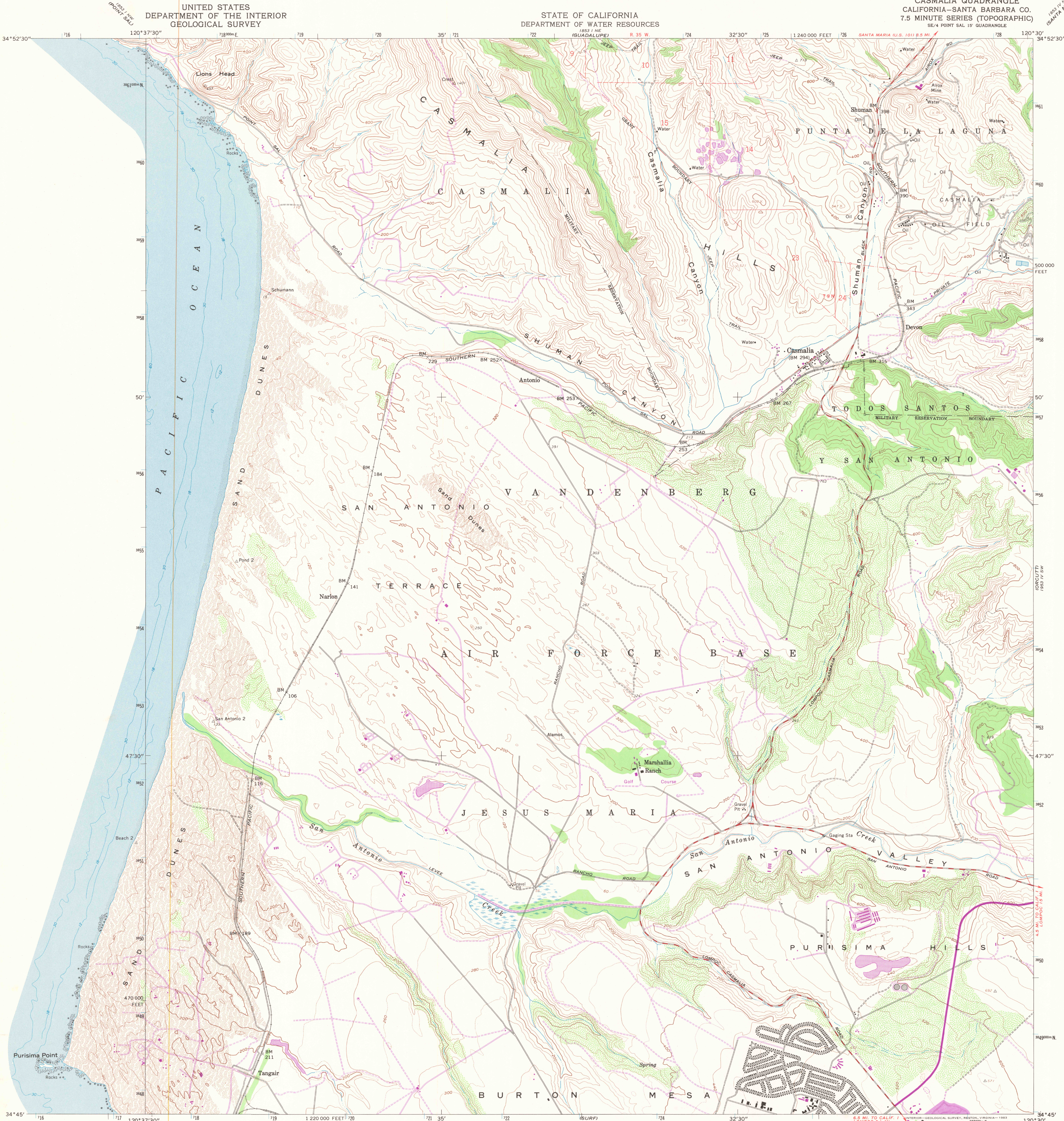

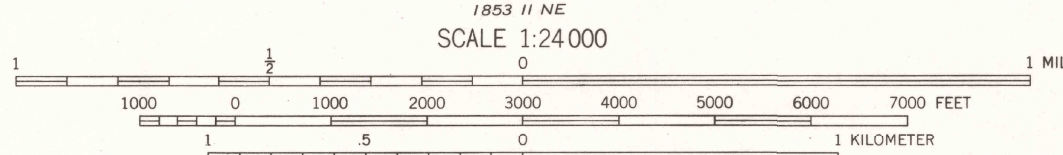
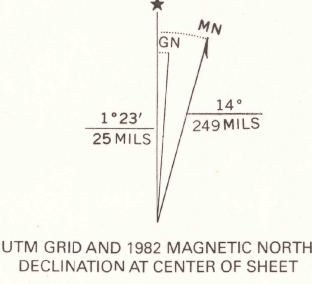

zone 10, shown in blue

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983
move the projection lines 5 meters north and
89 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks

Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations
There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of
the National or State lands
