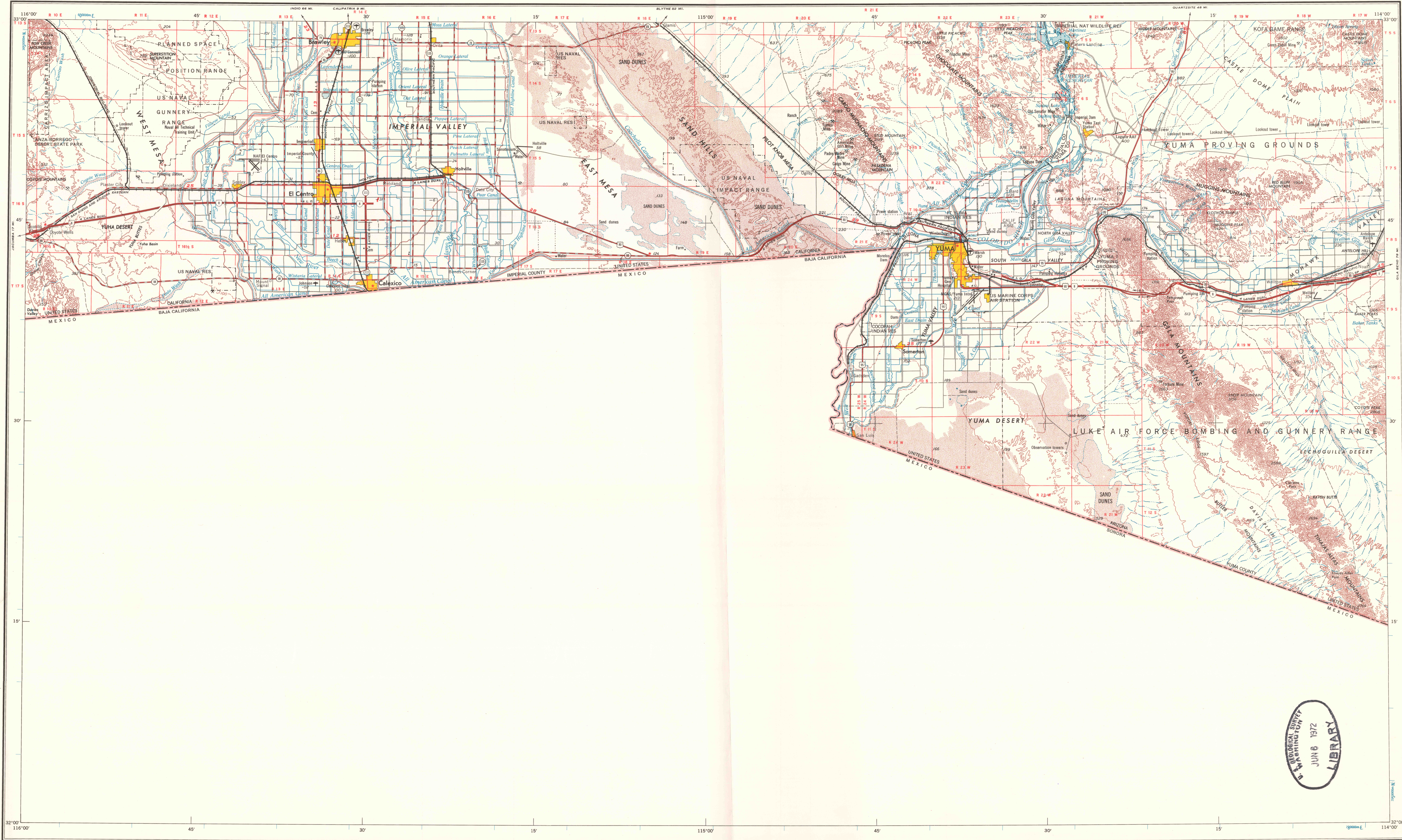

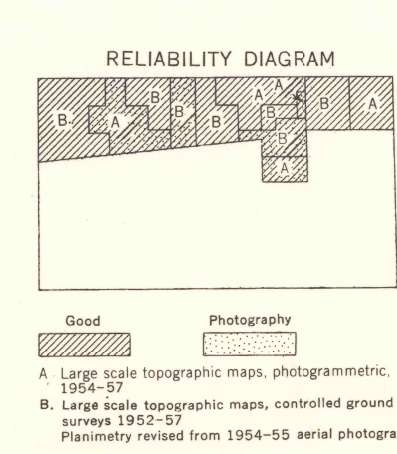
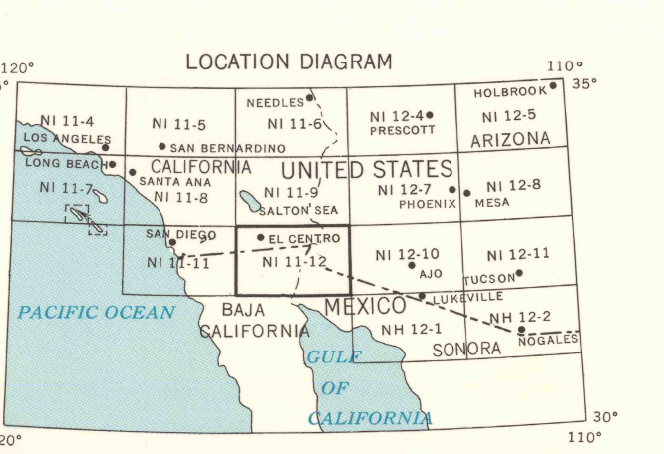
CONTOUR INTERVAL 200 FEET
