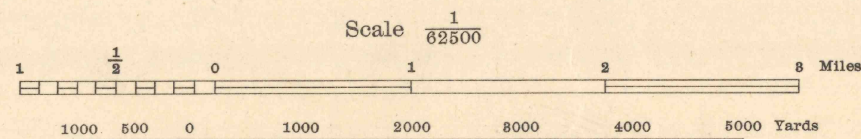
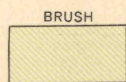

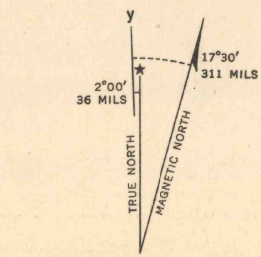

APPROXIMATE MEAN DECLINATION 1943
FOR CENTER OF SHEET
ANNUAL MAGNETIC CHANGE 0.2" INCREASE
USE DIAGONAL ONLY TO OBTAIN NUMERICAL VALUES. TO DETERMINE MAGNETIC NORTH LINE, CONNECT THE PIVOT POINT "P" ON THE SOUTH EDGE OF THE MAP WITH THE VALUE OF THE ANGLE BETWEEN GRID AND MAGNETIC NORTH, AS PLOTTED ON THE DEGREE SCALE AT THE NORTH EDGE OF THE MAP.
