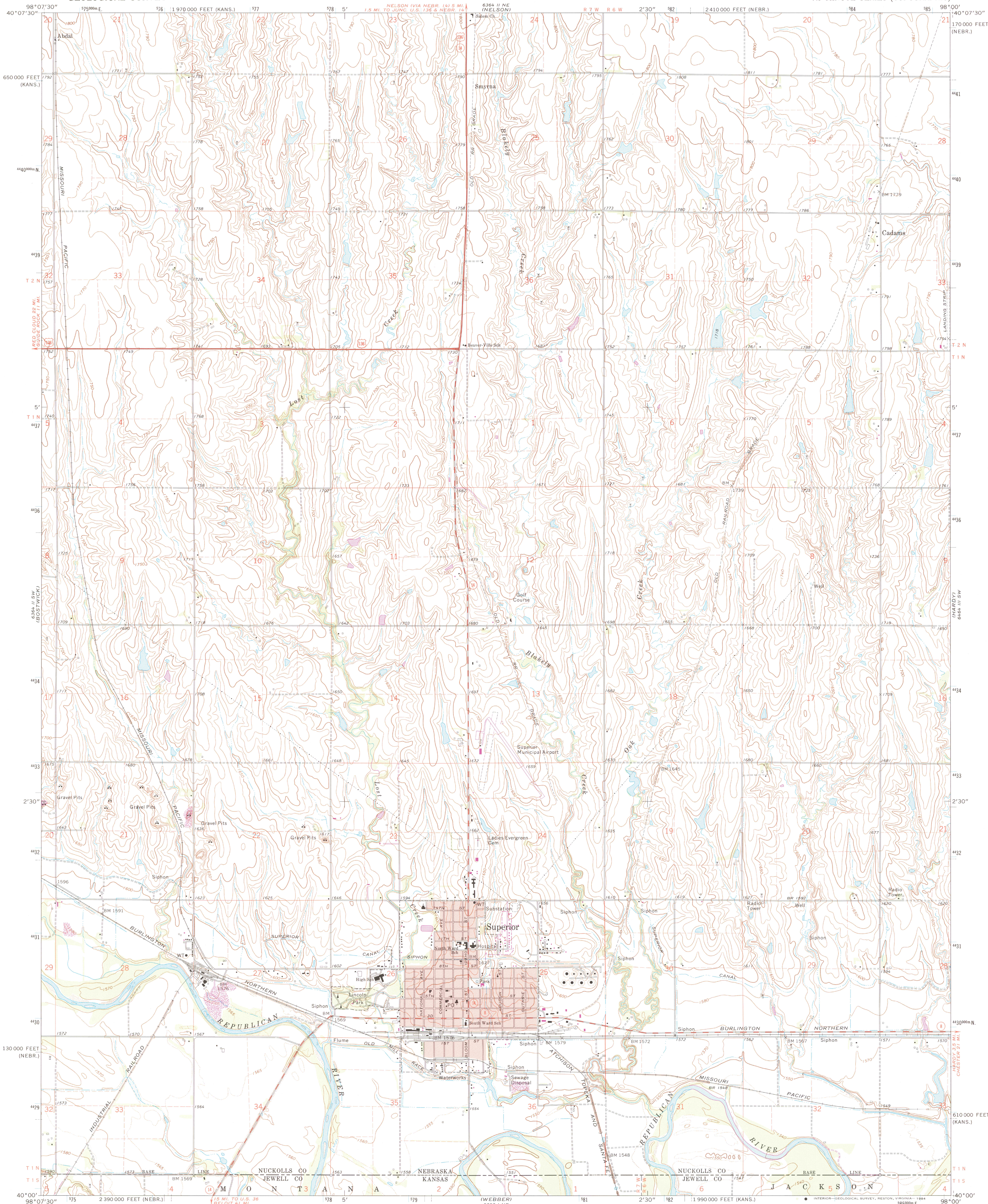

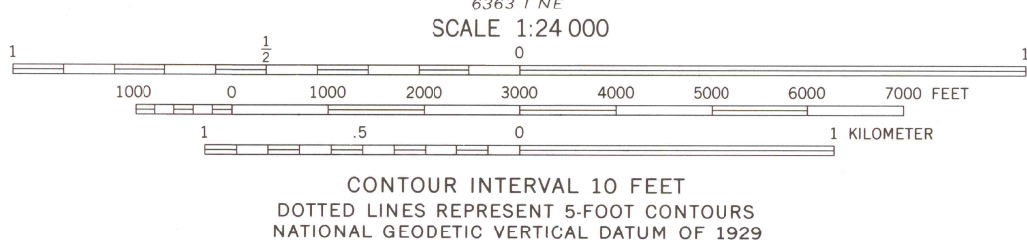
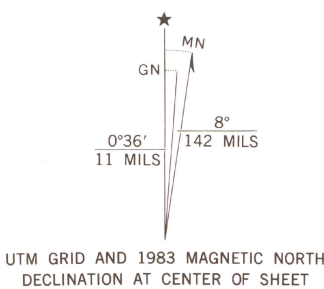

Projection: Nebraska coordinate system, south zone  
(Lambert conformal conic)  
10,000-foot grid ticks based on Nebraska coordinate  
system, south zone, and Kansas coordinate system, north zone  
1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks,  
zone 14, shown in blue. 1927 North American datum  
Red tint indicates areas in which only landmark buildings are shown  
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983,  
move the projection lines 4 meters north and  
29 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks
