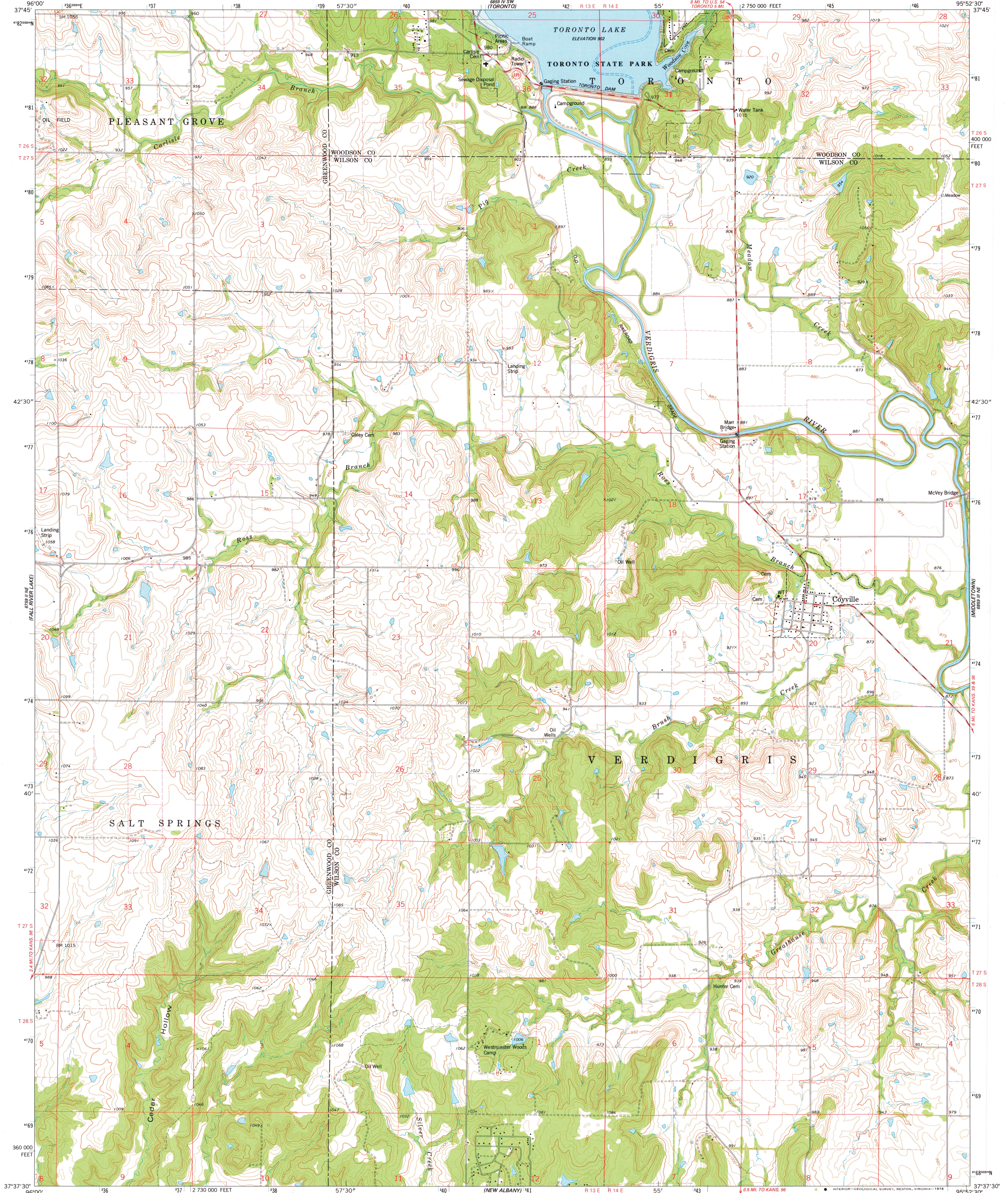

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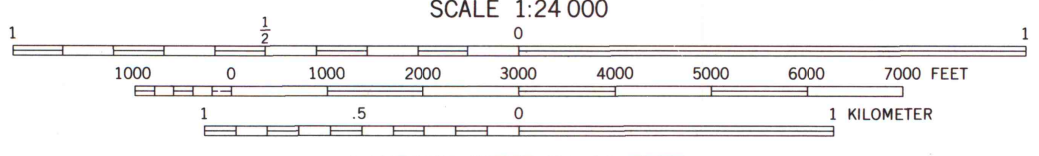
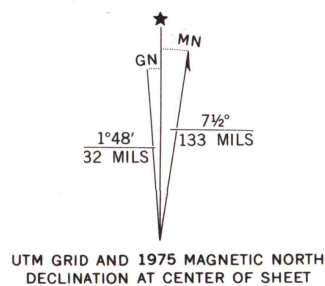

system, south zone (Lambert conformal conic)

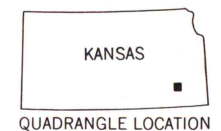
1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks,
