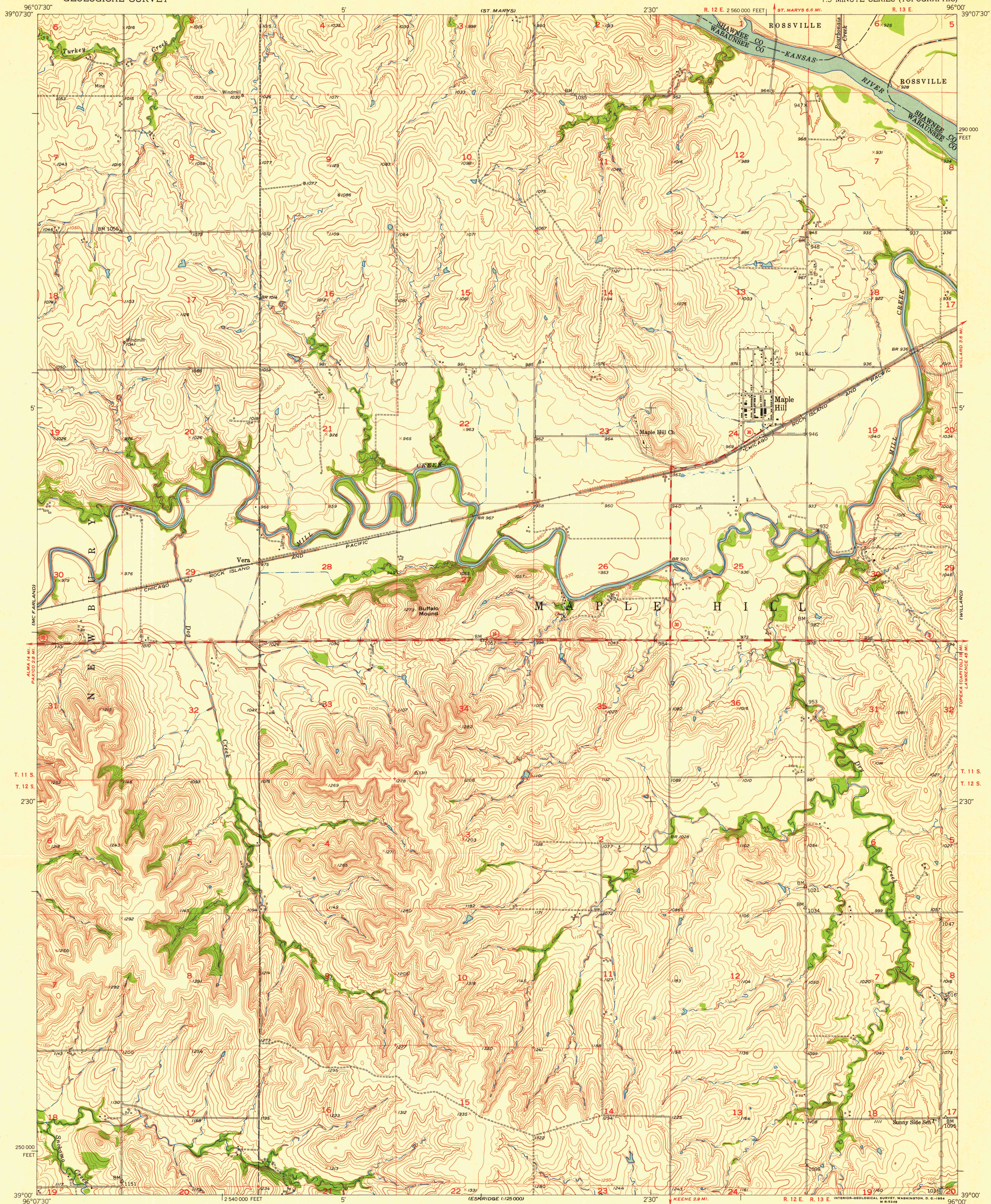




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Topography from aerial photographs by Kelsh plotter. Aerial photographs taken 1951. Field check 1952-1953.
