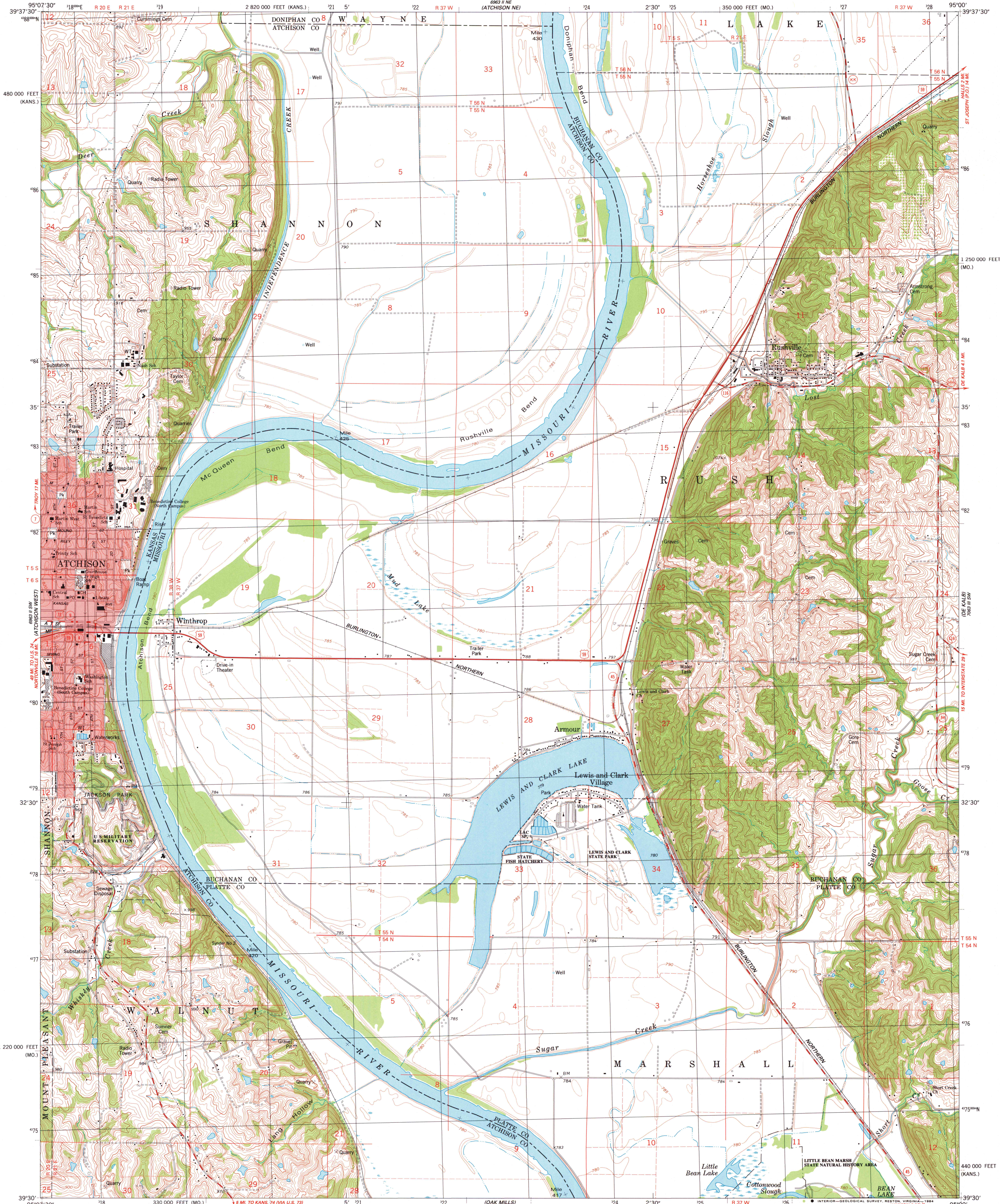
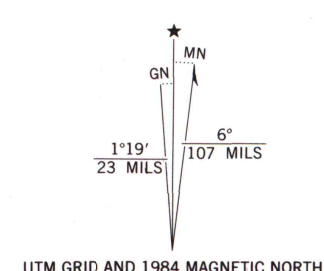

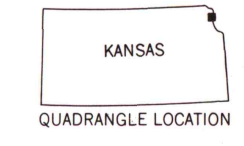
ATCHISON EAST QUADRANGLE
