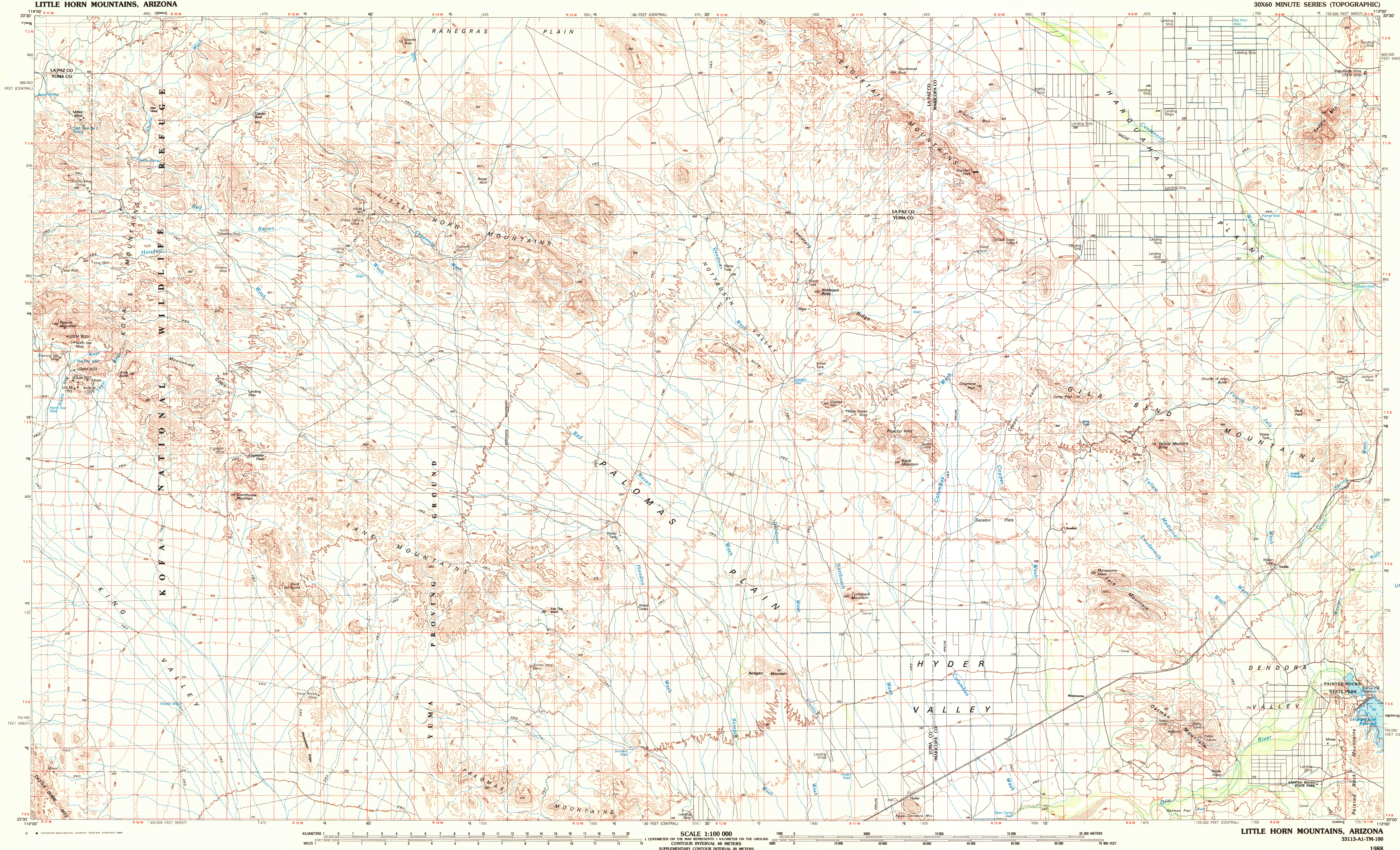
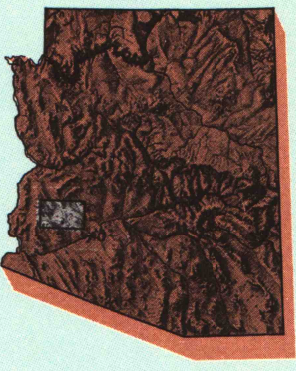




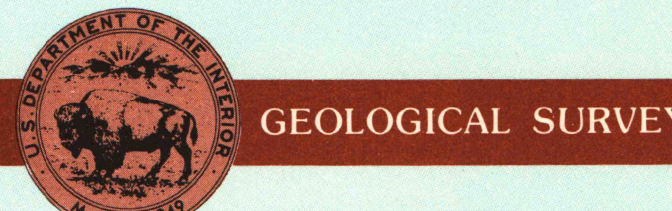
Little Horn Mountains ARIZONA
