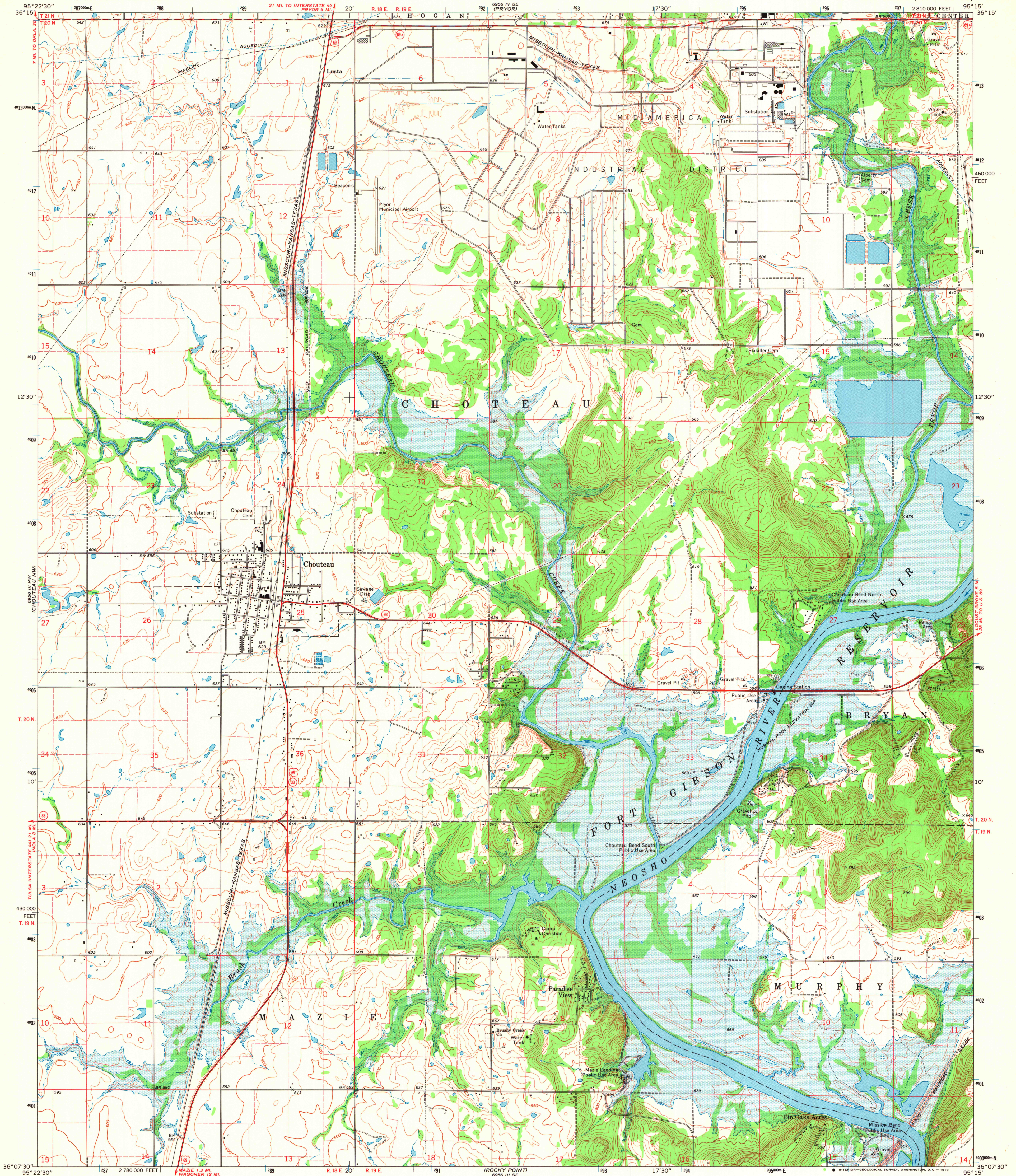

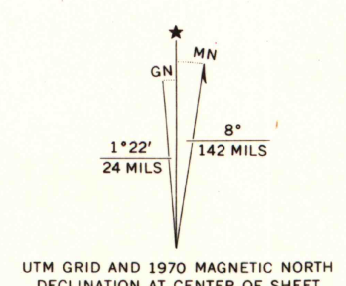

Topography by photogrammetric methods from aerial photographs taken 1968. Field checked 1970.

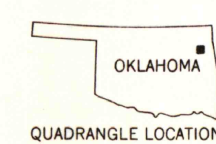
