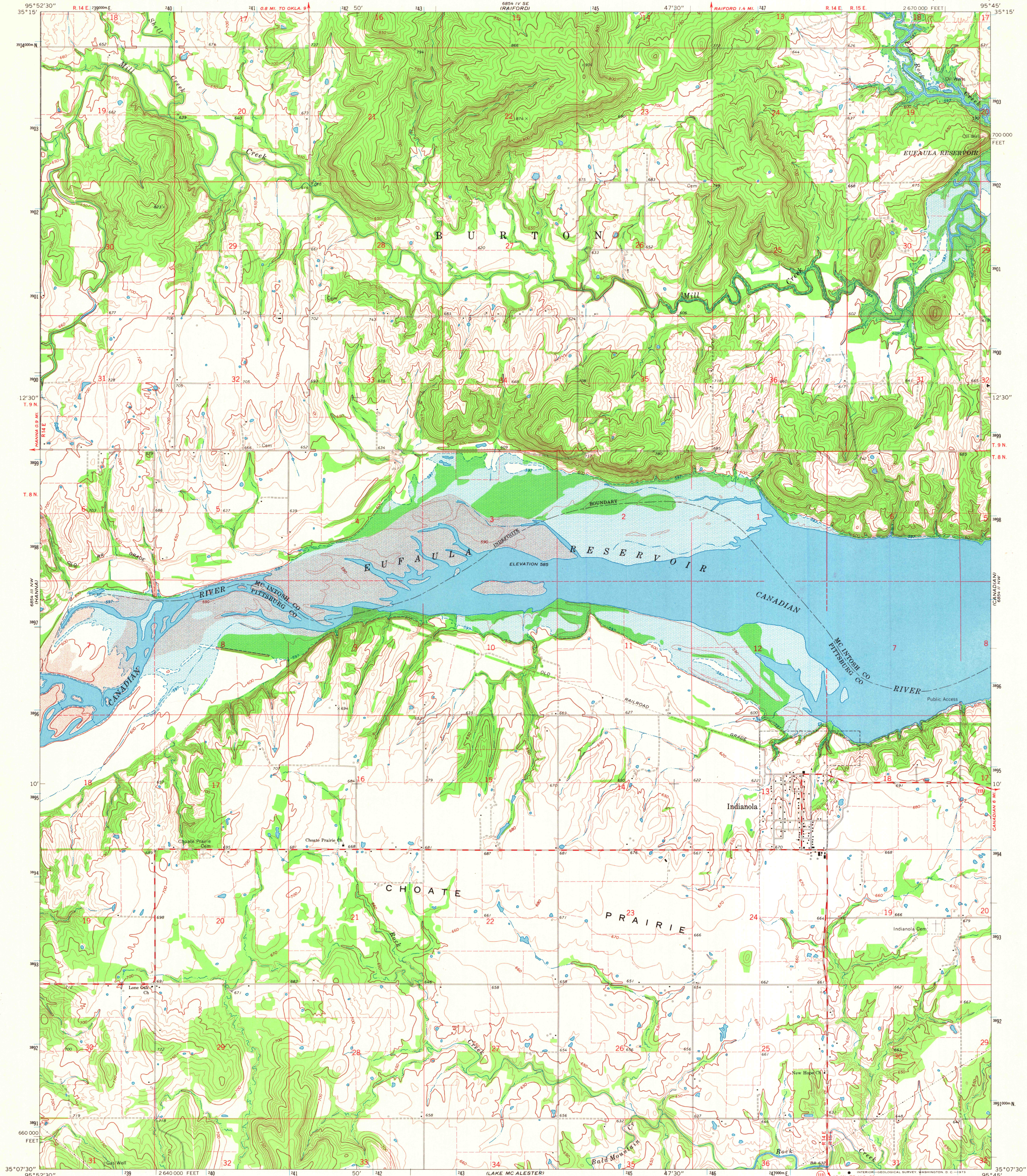

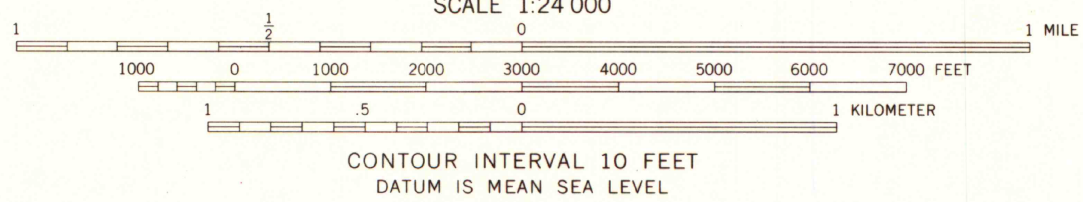
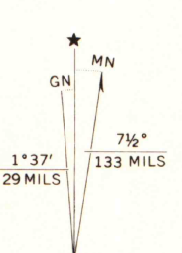

zone 15, shown in blue

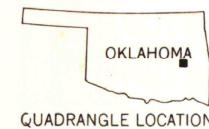
Areas covered by dashed light-blue pattern
