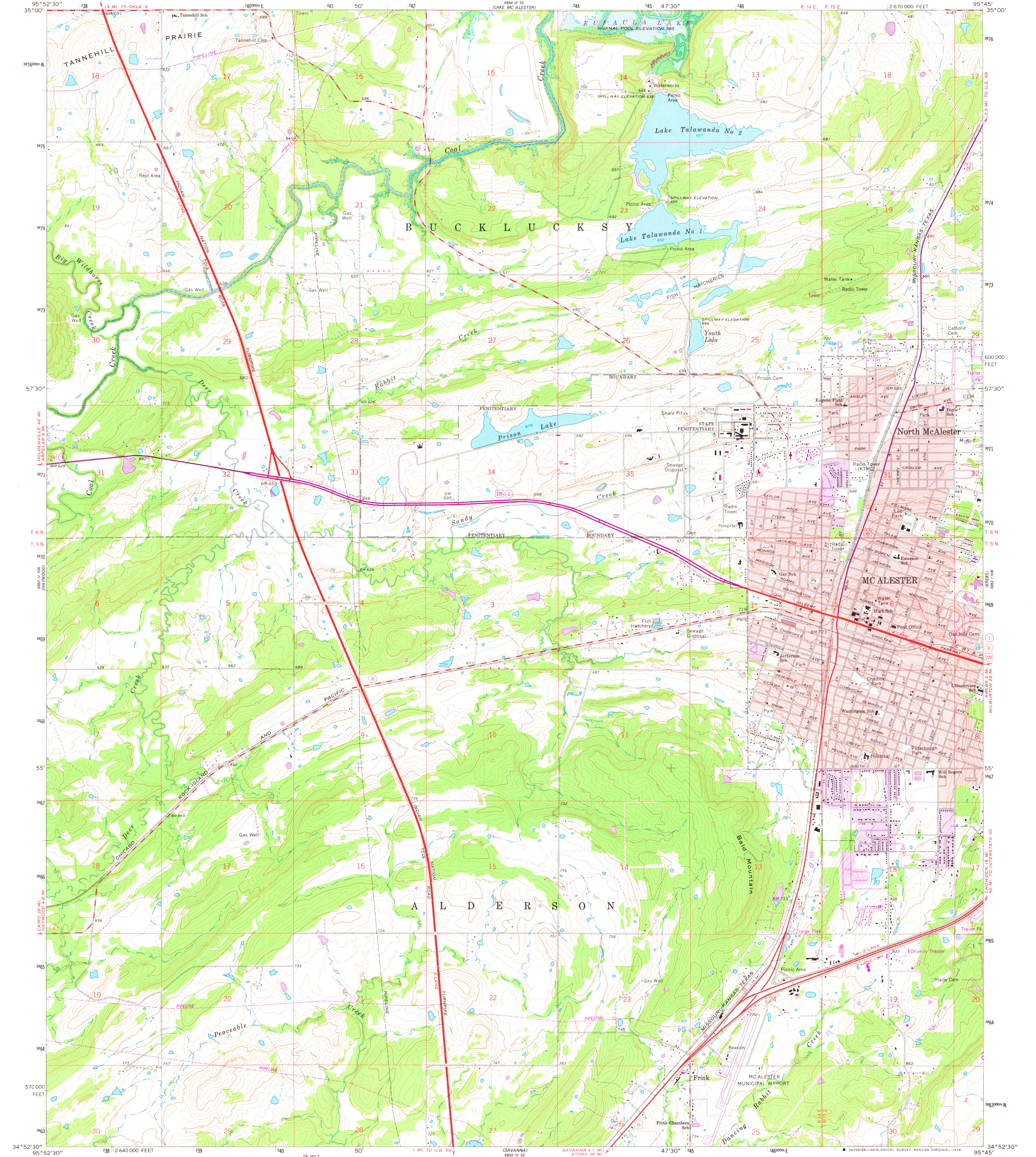




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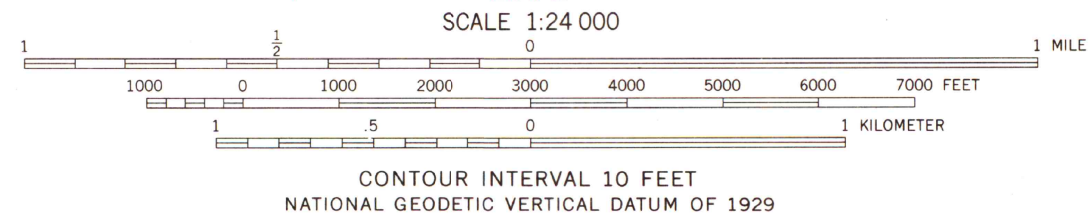
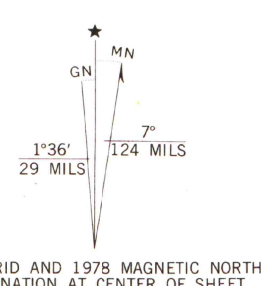
Topography by photogrammetric methods from aerial photographs taken 1966. Field checked 1967

Red tint indicates areas in which only landmark buildings are shown

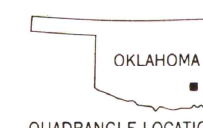
Areas covered by dashed light-blue pattern are subject to controlled inundation
