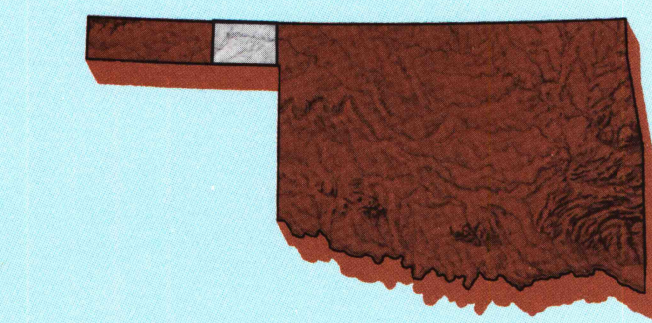

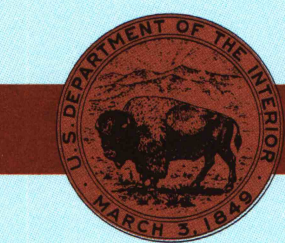
OKLAHOMA-KANSAS
