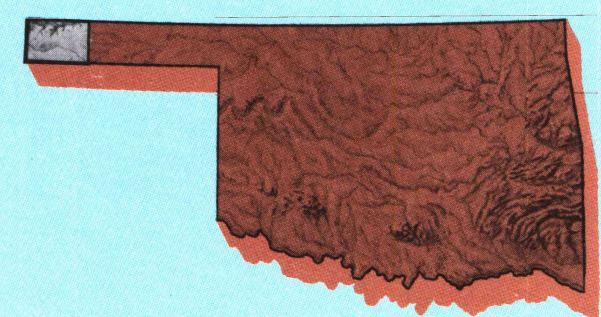

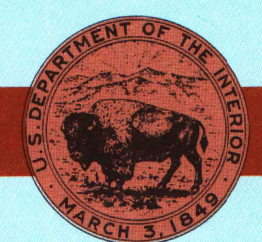
OKLAHOMA-COLORADO TEXAS-KANSAS
