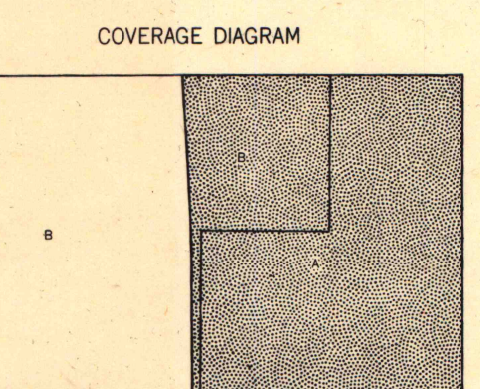
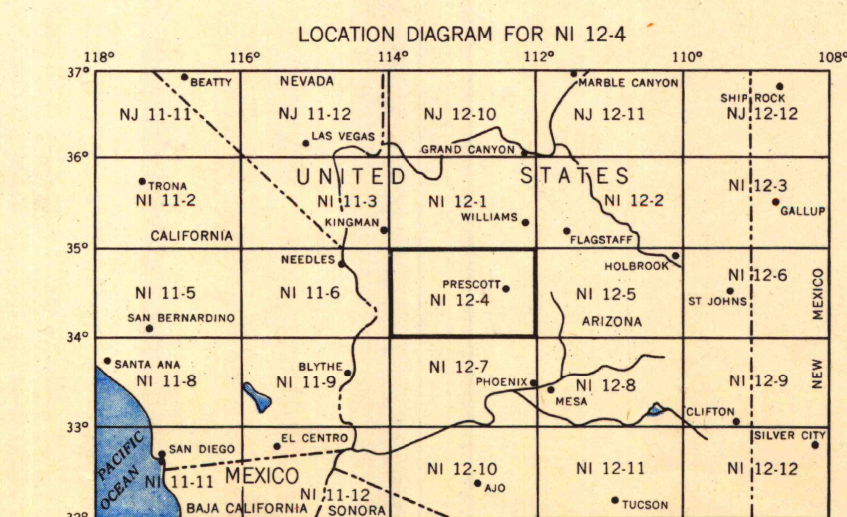
INDEX TO BOUNDARIES
