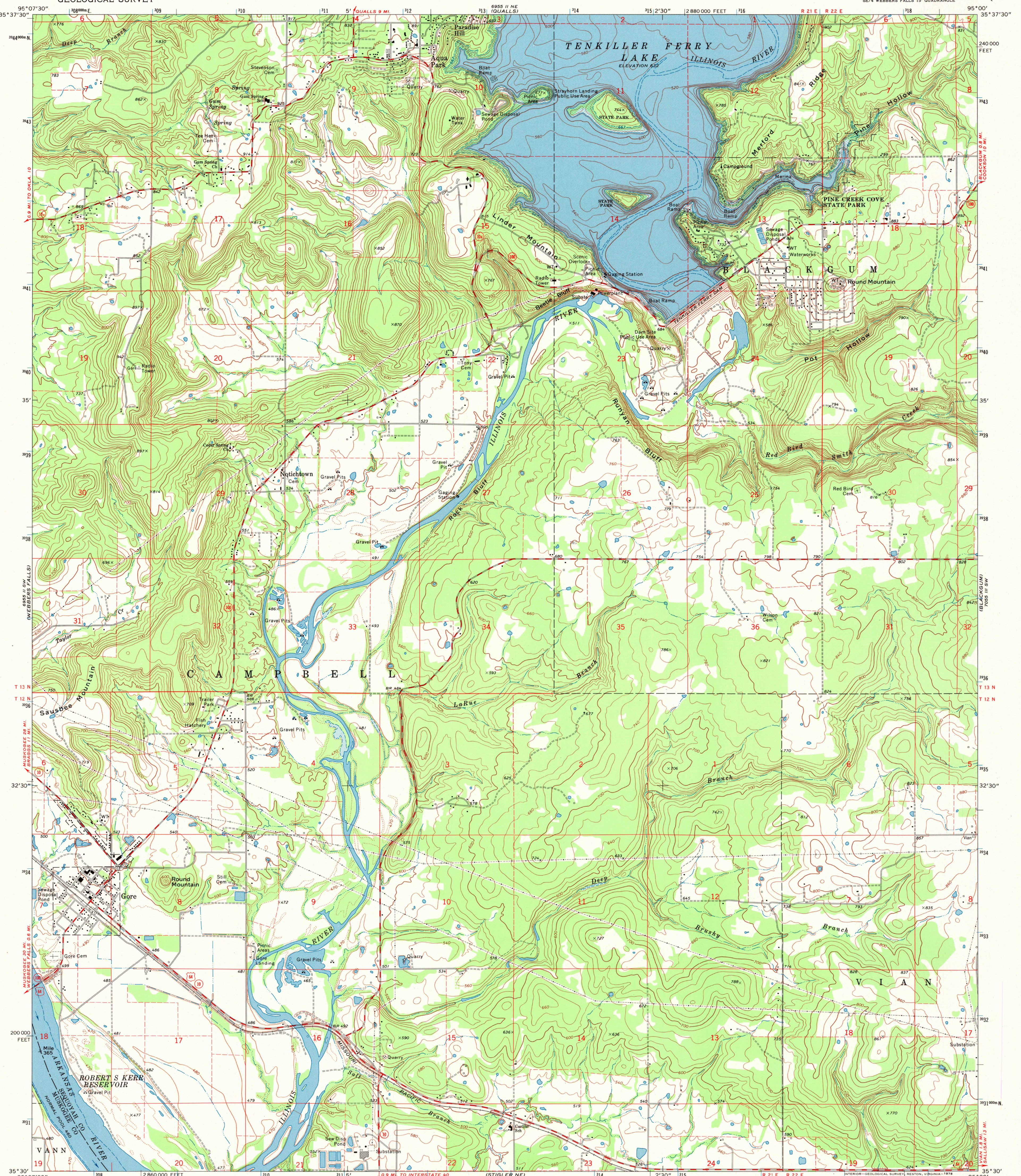

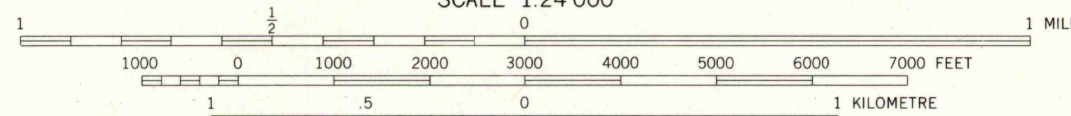
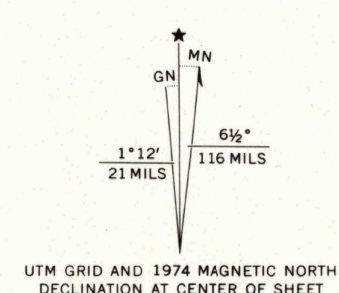

1000-metre Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 15, shown in blue. 1927 North American datum

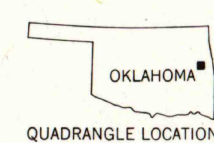
Areas covered by dashed light-blue pattern are subject to controlled inundation
