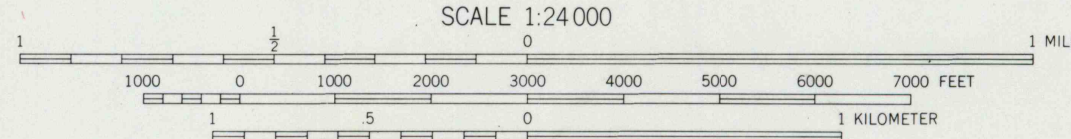
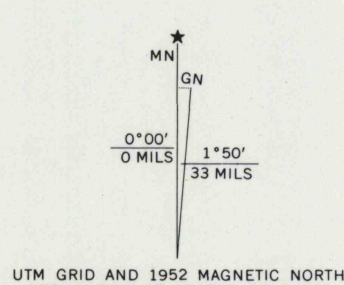
north zone

No major culture or drainage changes observed

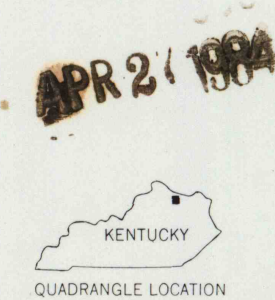
