

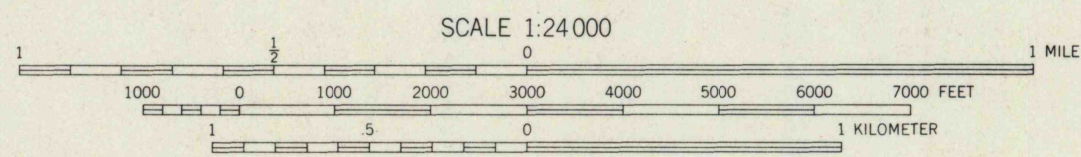
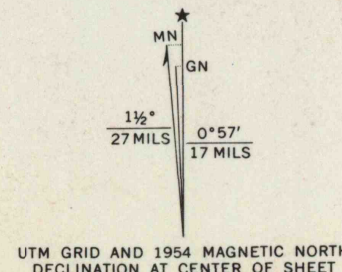

south zone

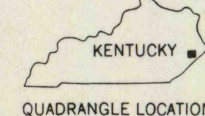
All wells shown are gas wells
