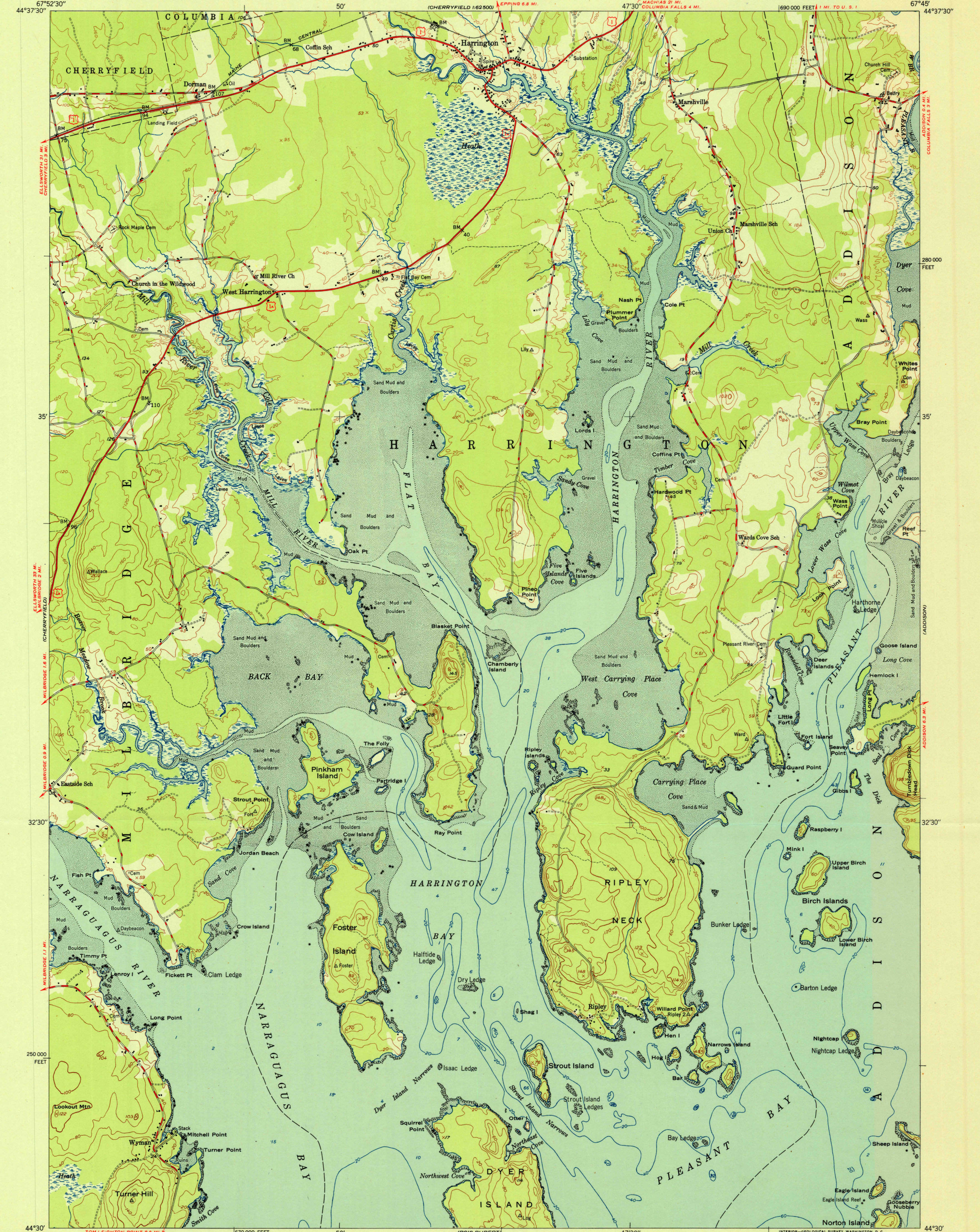

SE 1/4 CHERRYFIELD 15' QUADRANGLE

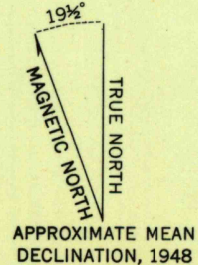

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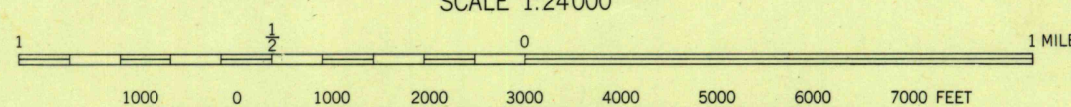
